V. Review Of AB109 Trust Fund and Budget

Elisha Hardison reported on the current status of the AB109 trust.

- Began fiscal year 2025/26 with approximately 10.9 million dollars in the trust, approximately 5.1 million of that is currently encumbered
- \$100,000 in annual training funds were lost in the prior year, there is currently just over \$500,000 in training funds leftover from prior years
- PRCS Only funds were also lost. These funds had been funding the Next Step program through Arcata House Partnership. There are not currently any unspent PRCS only funds from prior years. The Next Step program will continue and be absorbed into the larger Probation realignment budget utilizing funds that were previously allocated for the Substance Abuse Disorder (SUD) treatment.

VIII. DISCUSSION ITEM: CalAIM:

- There is a new staffing plan for CalAIM. The Humboldt County Correctional Facility (HCCF) and Humboldt County Probation Department (HCPD) have decided to jointly administer the budget for this program through one budget unit and will share positions as follows:
 - 1.0 Program Manager (stationed at the HCCF but providing oversight for HCCF and HCPD programs)
 - 1.0 Program Coordinator (stationed at the HCCF)
 - 1.0 Program Coordinator (stationed at the Juvenile Hall)
- Salaries will be paid for 1.5 – 3.5 years with PATH3 funds and perhaps PATH 4 funds (application was submitted but funds have not yet been awarded), Wellpath contract update also paid with PATH3/4 funds
- Billing reimbursement estimate is still unknown at this time, will be somewhat dependent on compliance (clean claims)
- 90 days on and off not just last 90 days before release
- Can we back bill for services provided before sentencing?
- Program Coordinators will have to be skilled positions with staff who know the system and how to maximize the 90 days
- CalAIM will reimburse for 2 weeks of meds in hand
- CalAIM may still require DHHS linkages for high needs
- There is concern about the transition of high needs individuals at Sempervirens and the HCCF
- DHHS met on Monday internally with finance staff to identify jail vs. Community Correction Resource Center (CCRC) positions and what the actual budget commitment is

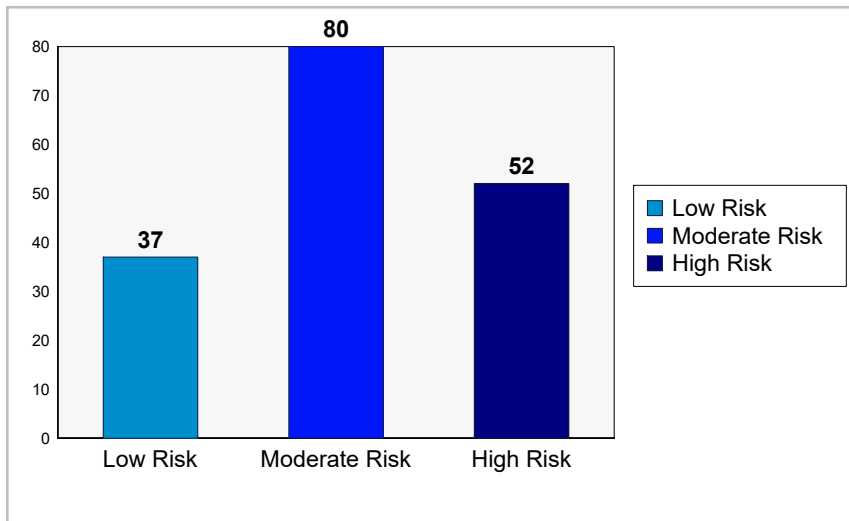

Active between 12/1/2025 and 12/31/2025**



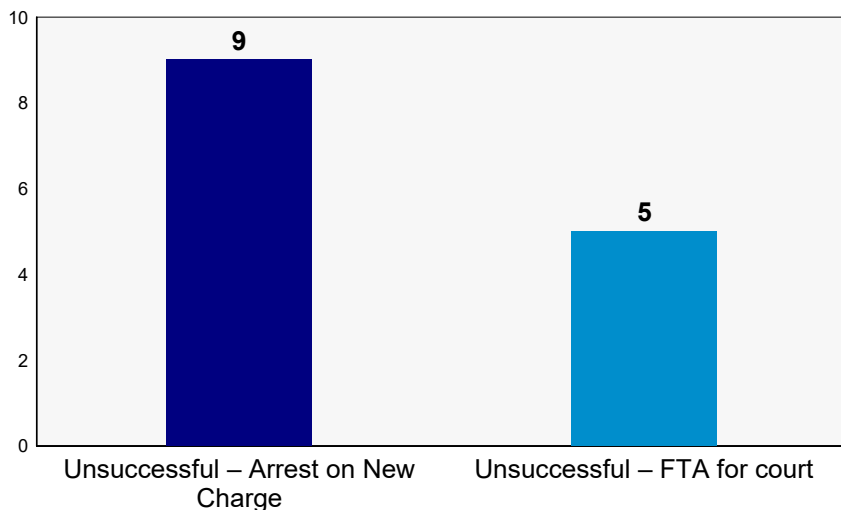

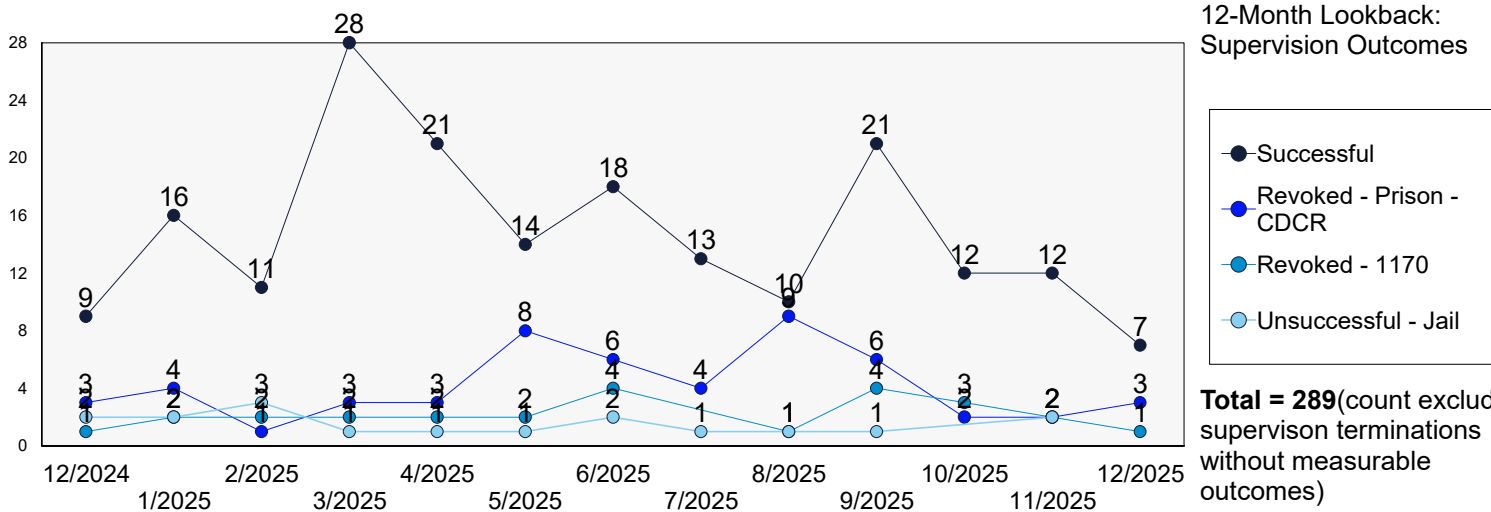

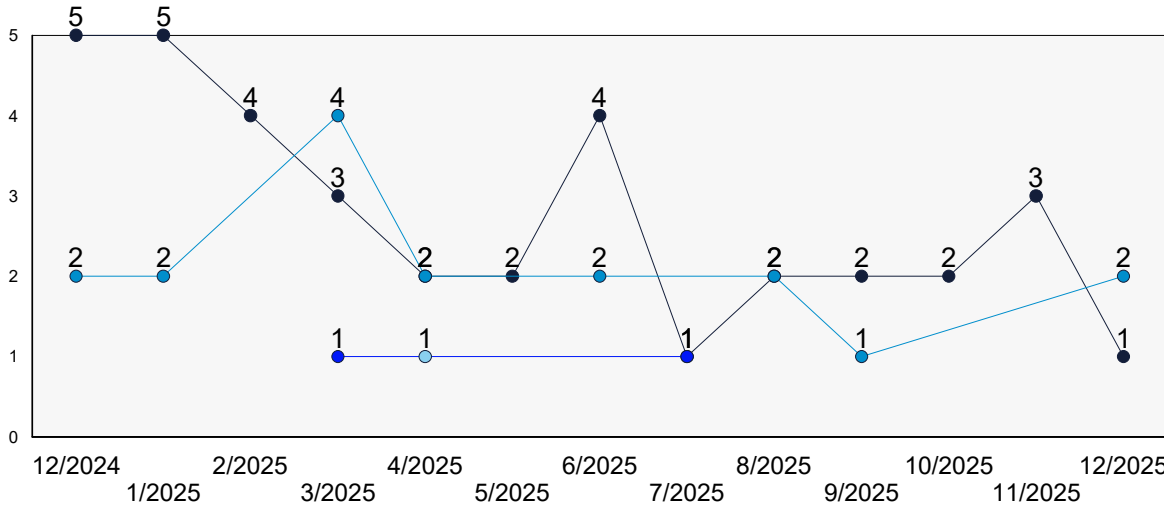

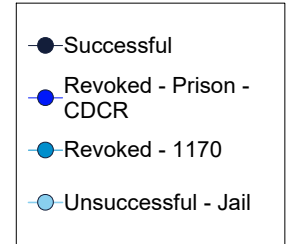

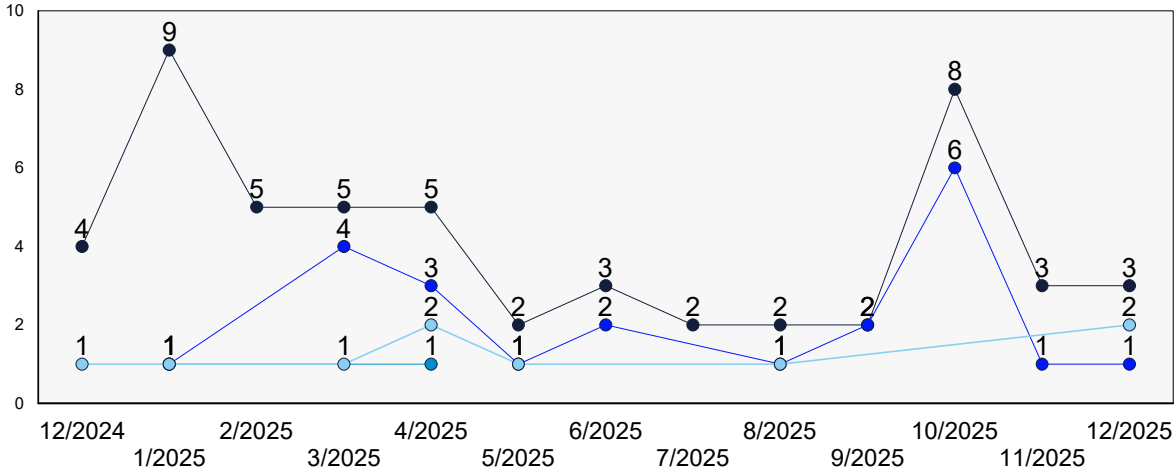

12-Month Lookback: Supervision Outcomes



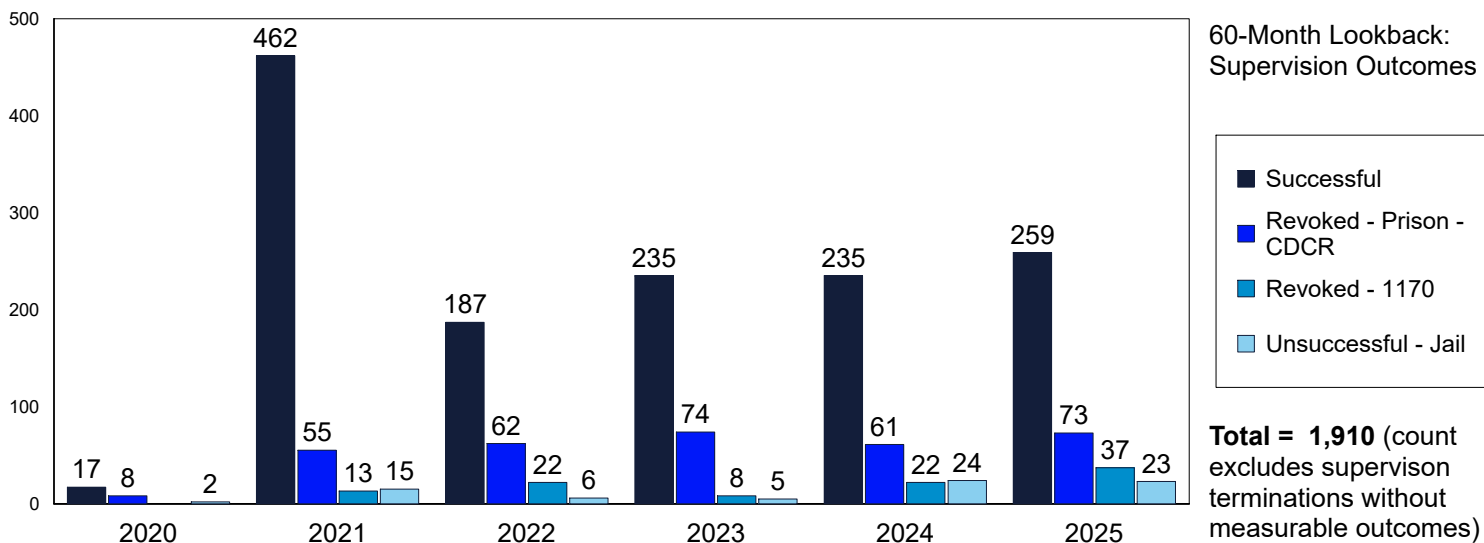

Adult Supervision Termination Outcomes (all Case Types) 60-Month Lookback from 12/1/2020 to 12/31/2025

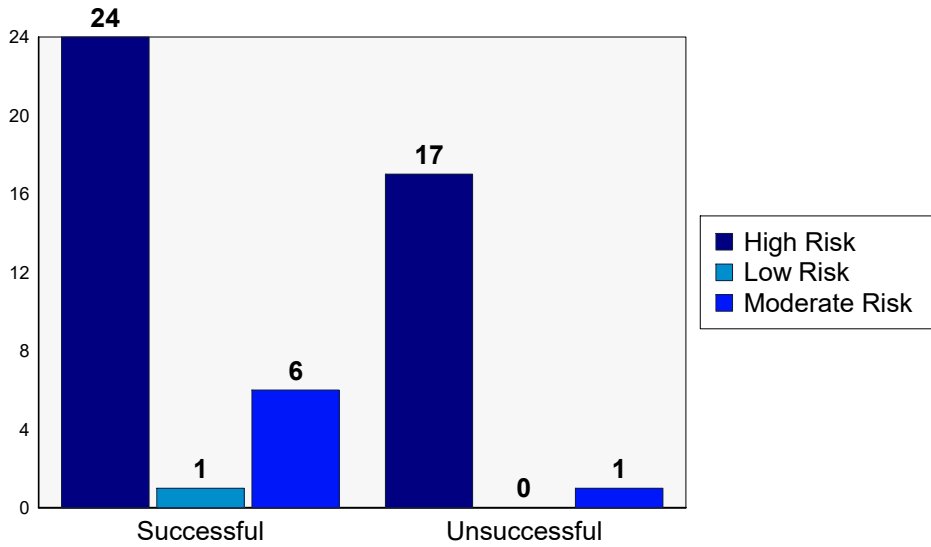

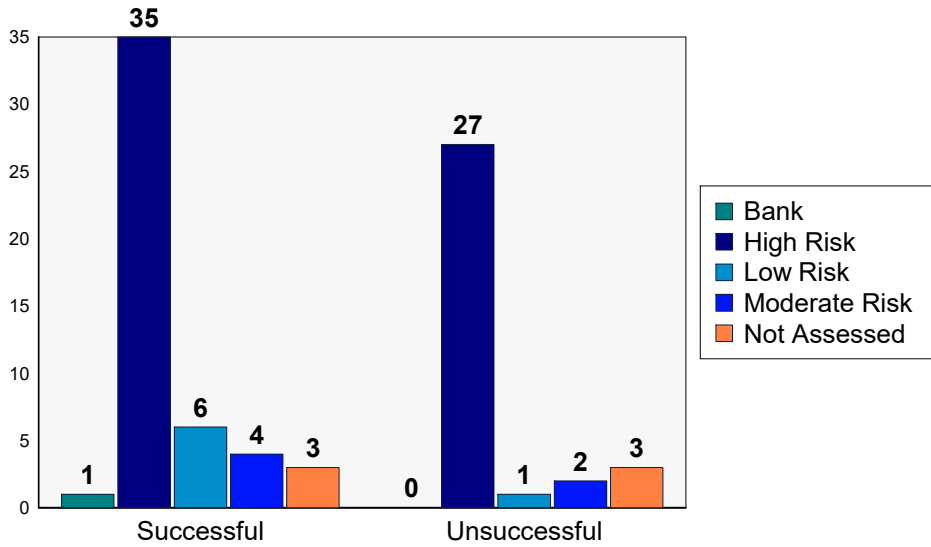
**Mandatory Supervision ("Split Sentence") Completion Outcomes by Risk Classification Levels
