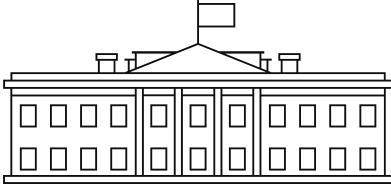


Primary Elections in California

All voters may vote in a primary election.
Voting for the President in the primary depends on the party you are registered with.
The March 5th Primary chooses the candidates who will run in the November General Election.

There will be three different types of primaries on your ballot:

Presidential Primary



One candidate nominated by each party nationwide

Statewide Primary



Top two candidates nominated by California voters

County Offices



Humboldt voters elect candidates with the possibility of a run-off

Who can vote in each type of primary election in 2024?

Only voters who registered in the same political party as the candidate can vote for these offices.

The following parties allow **voters who registered with No Party Preference (NPP)** to vote in their 2024 primary:

- Democratic
- American Independent
- Libertarian

All voters can vote for any candidate running for these offices regardless of their party affiliation.

All voters can vote for any candidate running for these offices.

Which offices can I vote for in each type of primary in 2024?

- U.S. President

The candidates' party **always** appears on the ballot.

- U.S. Senator
- U.S. Congress Member
- State Assembly Member

The candidates' party or "None" **always** appears on the ballot.

- County Supervisor
- Superior Court Judge

The candidates' party **never** appears on the ballot.

What is the result of each type of primary election?

One winner from each party's Presidential primary will be who represents that political party in the November General Election.

The top two candidates with the most votes move on to the November General Election.

It is possible that the top two candidates **have the same party preference**.

Candidates who receives 50% plus 1 vote are elected.

If no candidate receives this number of votes, the two candidates with the most votes move on to the General Election.
