TERM OF OFFICE; VACANCIES; SUCCEEDING NOMINATIONS


The Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt do ordain

SECTION 1. Section 2212-3 of the Humboldt County Code is
hereby amended to read as shown on the attached page 50.1.

days after the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 12

ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD

2212-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD.

There is hereby established for the County of Humboldt an Assessment Appeals Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code of California. (Added by Ord. 1364, Sec. 1, 10/30/79)

2212-2. SELECTION OF MEMBERS.

The Assessment Appeals Board shall consist of three (3) members and two (2) alternate members selected by lot by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of the County of Humboldt from among those persons nominated for that purpose by members of the Board of Supervisors. Within sixty (60) days after the adoption of this ordinance, each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) persons for appointment to the Assessment Appeals Board. (Added by Ord. 1364, Sec. 1, 10/30/79)

2212-3. TERM OF OFFICE; VACANCIES; SUCCEEDING NOMINATIONS.

The term of office of the first members of the Assessment Appeals Board shall be three (3) years for the member first selected, two (2) years for the second member selected, and one (1) year for the third member selected, all such terms to commence the first Monday in September, 1980. Thereafter the term of members shall be three (3) years. The Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Humboldt County shall select by lot one (1) person from among those nominated to serve for the succeeding term on such Board, or to fill the vacancy as the case may be. Upon expiration of the term of office of any member of the Assessment Appeals Board, the member whose term has expired shall continue to serve until such time as a new member takes office. A member whose term has expired may continue to serve for up to sixty (60) days after the expiration of such term with respect to matters on which the Assessment Appeals Board had commenced hearing prior to the expiration of the member's term. 2212-4. ELIGIBILITY.

A person shall not be eligible for nomination for membership on the Assessment Appeals Board unless he has a minimum of five (5) years professional experience in this state as one of the following: certified public accountant or public accountant, licensed real estate broker, attorney, property appraiser accredited by a nationally recognized professional organization, or a person who the nominating member of the Board of Supervisors has reason to believe is possessed of competent knowledge of property appraisal and taxation. No person shall be qualified to be a member of the Assessment Appeals Board who has,
