

ORDINANCE NO. 1364

ADDING CHAPTER 12 TO DIVISION 2 OF TITLE II
OF THE HUMBOLDT COUNTY CODE; ESTABLISHING AN
ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt do ordain
as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 12 is hereby added to Division 2 of
Title II of the Humboldt County Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 12

ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD

2212-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD.

There is hereby established for the County of Humboldt an Assessment Appeals Board pursuant to the provisions of Sections 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code of California.

2212-2. SELECTION OF MEMBERS.

The Assessment Appeals Board shall consist of three (3) members and two (2) alternate members selected by lot by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of the County of Humboldt from among those persons nominated for that purpose by members of the Board of Supervisors. Within sixty (60) days after the adoption of this ordinance, each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate not less than three (3), nor more than five (5), persons for appointment to the Assessment Appeals Board.

2212-3. TERM OF OFFICE: VACANCIES: SUCCEEDING NOMINATIONS.

The term of office of members selected to serve on the Assessment Appeals Board shall be three (3) years beginning on the first Monday in September of 1980. In the event of a vacancy on the Board, the person selected to fill the vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. Not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the term of office of any member of the Assessment Appeals Board and upon the occurrence of a vacancy on the Board, each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one (1) person for each office or vacancy to be filled. The Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Humboldt County shall select by lot one (1) person from among those nominated to serve for the succeeding term on such Board, or to fill the vacancy as the case may be. Upon expiration of the term of office of any member of the Assessment Appeals Board, the member whose term has expired shall continue to serve until such time

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Humboldt do ordain as follows:

2212-1. ESTABLISHMENT OF ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD.

There is hereby established for the County of Humboldt an Assessment Appeals Board pursuant to the provisions of Sections 1620 et seq. of the Revenue and Taxation Code of California.

2212-2. SELECTION OF MEMBERS.

The Assessment Appeals Board shall consist of three (3) members and two (2) alternate members selected by lot by the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of the County of Humboldt from among those persons nominated for that purpose by members of the Board of Supervisors. Within sixty (60) days after the adoption of this ordinance, each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate not less than three (3), nor more than five (5), persons for appointment to the Assessment Appeals Board.

2212-3. TERM OF OFFICE; VACANCIES; SUCCEEDING NOMINATIONS.

The term of office of members selected to serve on the Assessment Appeals Board shall be three (3) years beginning on the first Monday in September of 1980. In the event of a vacancy on the Board, the person selected to fill the vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. Not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the term of office of any member of the Assessment Appeals Board and upon the occurrence of a vacancy on the Board, each member of the Board of Supervisors shall

nominate one (1) person for each office or vacancy to be filled. The Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Humboldt County shall select by lot one (1) person from among those nominated to serve for the succeeding term on such Board, or to fill the vacancy as the case may be. Upon expiration of the term of office of any member of the Assessment Appeals Board, the member whose term has expired shall continue to serve until such time as a new member takes office. A member whose term has expired may continue to serve for up to sixty (60) days after the expiration of such term with respect to matters on which the Assessment Appeals Board had commenced hearing prior to the expiration of the members term.

2212-4. ELIGIBILITY.

A person shall not be eligible for nomination for membership on the Assessment Appeals Board unless he has a minimum of five (5) years professional experience in this state as one of the following: certified public accountant or public accountant, licensed real estate broker, attorney, property appraiser accredited by a nationally recognized professional organization, or a person who the nominating member of the Board of Supervisors has reason to believe is possessed of competent knowledge of property appraisal and taxation. No person shall be qualified to be a member of the Assessment Appeals Board who has, within three (3) years immediately preceding his appointment, been an employee of an Assessor's Office. No member of the Assessment Appeals Board shall knowingly participate in any assessment appeal proceeding wherein the member has an interest in either the subject matter of, or a party to the proceeding of such nature that it could reasonably be expected to influence the impartiality of his judgment in the proceedings.

2212-5. CLERK'S DUTIES.

The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall be the Clerk of the Assessment Appeals Board and keep a record of its proceedings. He shall perform the same duties in connection with its proceedings as he is required by law to perform in connection with the proceedings with the Board of Equalization. The Clerk of the Assessment Appeals Board shall appoint all employees in his department who are to perform duties in connection with the Assessment Appeals Board proceedings and shall fix the time and place of sessions of the Assessment Appeals Board. He shall calendar all petitions or applications to be heard by the Assessment Appeals Board and notify all petitioners of the time and place fixed for such hearings.

2212-6. DUTIES OF ALTERNATE MEMBERS.

The duties of alternate members of the Assessment Appeals Board shall be as specified in Section 1622.5 of the Revenue and Taxation Code of California.

2212-7. COMPENSATION.

Members of the Assessment Appeals Board and alternate members serving in place of absent regular members of the Assessment Appeals Board shall be compensated at the rate of Forty Dollars (\$40.00) for each one-half (1/2) day and Seventy-five Dollars (75.00) for each full day of assessment appeals hearings they are required to attend.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of its passage.
