

Medication Reconciliation Report for FY 25-26 Q2

October 2025

10 charts were reviewed for October.

100% of the medication reconciliation forms were initiated within 24 hours of admission.

60% of the required fields were completed within 36 hours of admission.

There were 51 medications prescribed.

25 of the medications had no discrepancy.

The percentage of medications with no discrepancy was 49%

November 2025

10 charts were reviewed for November.

100% of the medication reconciliation forms were initiated within 24 hours of admission.

60% of the required fields were completed within 36 hours of admission.

There were 45 medications prescribed.

12 of the medications had no discrepancy.

The percentage of medications with no discrepancy was 27%

December 2025

10 charts were reviewed for December.

100% of the medication reconciliation forms were initiated within 24 hours of admission.

70% of the required fields were completed within 36 hours of admission.

There were 69 medications prescribed.

49 of the medications had no discrepancy.

The percentage of medications with no discrepancy was 57%

FY 25/26 Q2

30 charts were reviewed for FY 25/26 Q2

100% of the medication reconciliation forms were initiated within 24 hours of admission.

63% of the required fields were completed within 36 hours of admission.

There were 165 medications prescribed.

86 of the medications had no discrepancy.

The percentage of medications with no discrepancy was 44%

Medication Reconciliation Comments

Area of Improvement/Concern: Nothing entered.

Timely initiation of Medication Reconciliation: 100% of forms were initiated within 24 hrs of admission, showing continued improvement over past 2 quarters. Awesome job.

Completion of required fields: 63% of charts had all required fields completed within 36 hrs, up from 33% last quarter.

We saw improvement in staff documentation of last dose and MD rationale for medication discrepancies. Last dose was documented in 93% of the charts which is a huge improvement from past quarter at 46% of charts. MD rationale was fully completed in 66% of the charts which is an improvement from last quarter at 24%.

MD rationale for medication discrepancies is an area that requires continued focus for improvement.
