Rates of RSV illness and hospitalization in California children remain high and are expected to stay high for the next several weeks. See recommended extension of RSV vaccine schedule below:

CDPH Health Alert- March 10, 2026: This health alert is issued to inform healthcare providers about the ongoing transmission in California of Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), the most common cause for hospitalization in infants in the US. As [RSV infections are likely to continue into April 2026](#), CDPH recommends continuing RSV immunization of eligible infants and young children with RSV monoclonal antibody products through April 30, 2026.
