



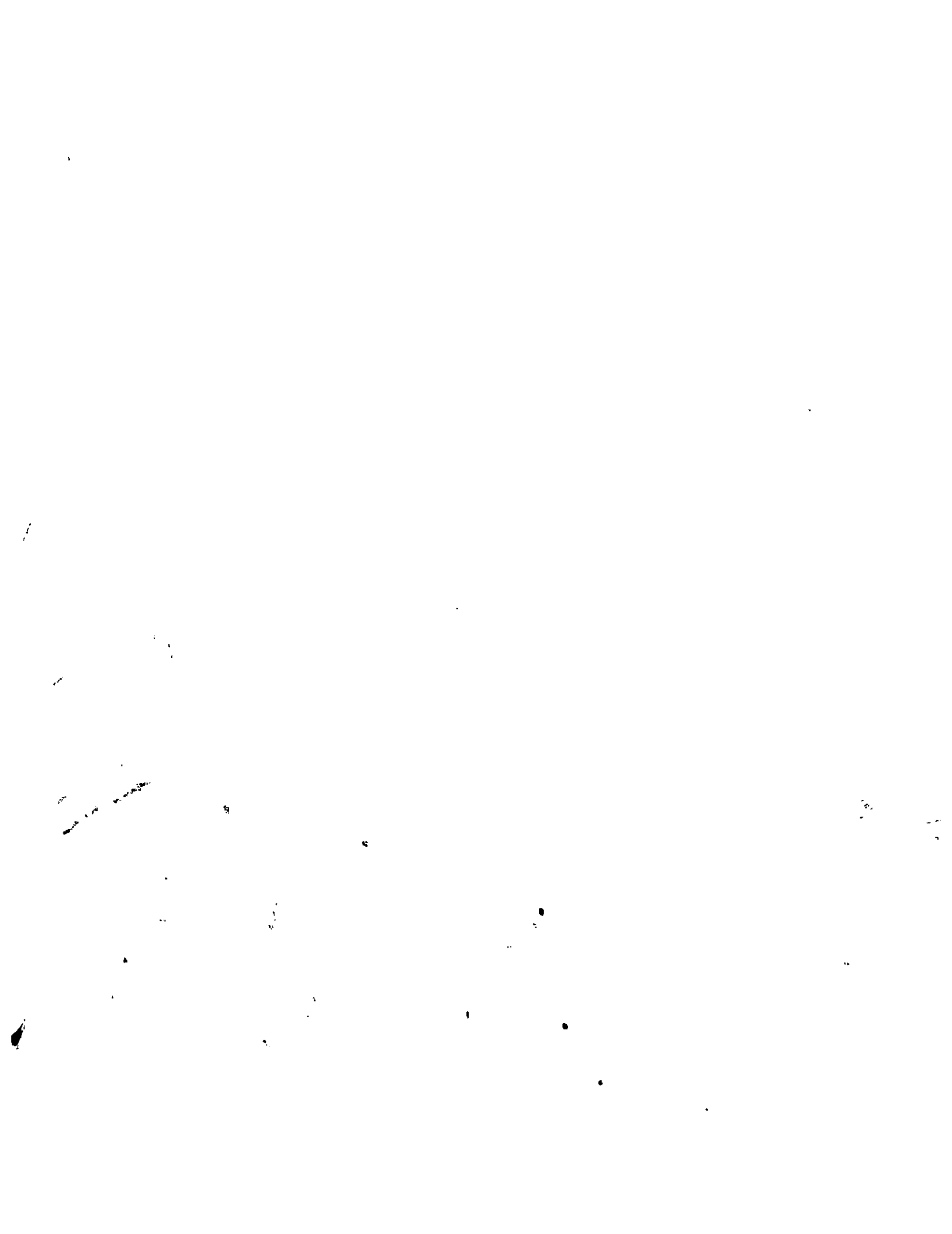

NARRATIVE - Initial Response 232

On 09/09/2017, at approximately 0125 hours, I was dispatched to a report of a physical fight in the area of Everette's Bar, 784 9th St. The reporting party stated there was a group of male subjects fighting in the street.

I responded with my emergency lights and siren activated and arrived at approximately 0127 hours. As I arrived on scene, I saw a subject, later identified as [REDACTED], in the street. [REDACTED] was wearing a black sweatshirt that read "#freedeezy" and had pants with a white stripe on the back. [REDACTED] was jumping up and down in the street and holding his waistband. As I exited my vehicle, [REDACTED] turned and ran westbound on 9th St. I did not pursue him.

I did not see any other subjects that might have been involved in a fight. I was then dispatched to an unconscious male in the area of H St. and 8th St. Sgt. Altizer and I went to check on the welfare of the male and to see if he was involved in the assault. We contacted the subject, who appeared to be intoxicated and unrelated to the fight. We were attempting to secure a ride home for the subject when Officer O'Donovan radioed that he was out with a vehicle and subjects that were involved in the fight. Officer O'Donovan also stated that one subject was possibly armed with a firearm.

I ran to my vehicle and drove eastbound on 8th St., northbound on G St., and westbound on 9th St. While en route, I heard Officer O'Donovan radio that the vehicle was directly in front of Everette's Bar. I saw a [REDACTED] truck [REDACTED] parked in front of Everette's. As I stopped my vehicle, I saw motion near the passenger's side rear door of the truck. I directed my spotlight on the area and saw [REDACTED] standing near the open door. I watched as [REDACTED] raised a handgun with a silver slide with [REDACTED] right hand and pointed it in the direction of Officer Altic, who was standing on the south side of 9th St. approximately 20 feet from the eastern curb prolongation of H St.

[REDACTED] ducked [REDACTED] head into [REDACTED] left armpit, as if hiding [REDACTED] face from the glare of my spotlight, and jumped backwards while still pointing the gun at Officer Altic. I saw Officer Altic running towards [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] continued to jump backwards towards Toby and Jack's Bar. I exited my vehicle and drew my service weapon, but did not point it at [REDACTED] due to [REDACTED] erratic motion and the bystanders behind [REDACTED] on the sidewalk in front of Arcata Liquors. I radioed "Gun!" and I ran towards [REDACTED] who had since gone to the sidewalk in front of a [REDACTED] truck [REDACTED] that was parked two spaces east of the [REDACTED]. I ran to the passenger side of the [REDACTED] in an attempt to flank [REDACTED] and obtain a better backdrop.

As I came around to the front of the [REDACTED], I heard a volley of gunshots from the sidewalk. I saw [REDACTED] lying on the sidewalk against the south wall of Everette's Bar. Officer Altic was firing his weapon at [REDACTED] who was still holding the gun in [REDACTED] right hand. I radioed "Shots fired. Start medical." I pointed my service weapon at [REDACTED]. Officer O'Donovan also pointed his service weapon at [REDACTED]. Officer Altic took the gun out of [REDACTED] right hand and placed it on the sidewalk. I holstered my service weapon and turned [REDACTED] face down on the sidewalk, handcuffing [REDACTED] hands behind [REDACTED] back.

Officer Altic said he did not know if he had been shot, but felt something wrong with his upper inner thigh.

A "Code 30" was requested and Officers and Deputies from other agencies began arriving soon

thereafter.

██████ stopped breathing, so I turned him over on his back and began CPR. Officer McKenzie arrived on scene and assisted me with CPR. Medical arrived and began treating ██████

I began assisting with crowd control. The crowd, as a whole, was intoxicated and unruly. It took physical pushing and shouting for the crowd to move back. Officer McKenzie strung crime scene tape from the stop sign on the northeast corner of 9th St. and H St. to a lamp post on the northwest corner of the plaza, to a vehicle parked on the south side of the 700 block of 9th St., to a tree on the sidewalk in front of the Alibi Restaurant.

██████ was transported to Mad River Community Hospital and was pronounced deceased a short time later.

I began a crime scene log. I placed folded evidence envelopes over the spent casings and other evidence on the sidewalk. The Humboldt County Critical Incident Response Team (C.I.R.T) was requested and arrived soon thereafter.

I contacted a witness, ██████████, who stated that he had seen ██████ brandish the firearm during the physical altercation. I obtained his contact information and he was released from the scene.

I was relieved from the scene so I could respond to the police department to give a statement.

**SUPPLEMENT 1 - Initial Response 228**

On 9/09/17 at about 0200 hrs, I was notified of an officer involved shooting in Arcata by dispatch who requested my immediate response.

I responded to the Arcata Police Department where I met with Lt. Silvers who quickly briefed me on the incident. Lt. Silvers requested that I respond to the Mad River Community Hospital to assist Officer Marr with securing the deceased body, identified as [REDACTED], pending the arrival of the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) and coroner.

I arrived at the hospital at about 0250 hrs. Upon arrival, I contacted Officer Marr who had been standing by with [REDACTED] body. Officer Marr photographed the scene in hospital room #1 where [REDACTED] had been pronounced deceased. I later took possession of the photographs and burned them to a CD and booked them into evidence (Item #48).

Officer Altic with Humboldt State University Police Department was also at the hospital being treated for a gunshot wound sustained during this incident. I took possession of Officer Altic's property from the hospital to include his uniform & clothing, duty gear, and firearm and secured it in my locked vehicle.

I stood by with [REDACTED] body until Investigator Jennifer Turner (CIRT) arrived on scene. CIRT processed the scene and collected the evidence while waiting for the coroner to arrive. Humboldt County Coroner Trever Enright arrived on scene and began processing the body assisted by Detective Ron Harpham (CIRT). Humboldt State Evidence Technician Zan Mendonca was on scene to take photographs. I remained on scene until the coroner had collected [REDACTED] body and all the evidence had been collected.

I released Officer Altic's property to Det. Ron Harpham who transported all the evidence to the Arcata Police Department for processing.

On 9/9/17 at about 0125 hours I responded with other APD officers to the area of 9th St/H St for a physical fight. I arrived in the area and heard other units advise that they were unable to locate the fight.

APD dispatch advised of a man down in the area of 8th St/H St and that it was unknown if it was associated with the fight. I responded and was flagged down by two by-standers who had found a male subject who was passed out. The male was now alert and talking. He denied being in any fight and just appeared to be intoxicated.

Officer Falkenstine arrived to assist me. As we were working on a safety plan for the male subject, I heard Officer O'Donovan broadcast over the radio that UPD was conducting a vehicle investigation on a vehicle that was possibly involved in the fight earlier and that they received a report that a subject had a gun.

I began walking from H St/8th St N/B along H St towards 9th St. As I approached 9th St, I saw a subject near the passenger's side of a dark truck. I saw a subject making big gestures with arms and acting erratically. I then heard somebody yell "gun, gun, gun!" I then heard multiple gunshots and saw Officer O'Donovan and Officer Altic advancing on the subject that I had seen near the passenger side of the truck. I ran to that location as I continued to hear shots being fired.

I got to right behind Officer O'Donovan and saw a subject on the ground. I could clearly see a gun clenched in the subject's hand. The subject was not moving. I held the subject at gunpoint while another officer attempted to remove the gun from the subject's hand.

I heard from Officer O'Donovan that Officer Altic had been hit by gunfire. I asked Officer Altic if he was hit, and he was not sure at the time. I asked Officer Altic to step back from the scene and stand by for medical response.

As I was assisting Officers with the subject who was down on the ground, I looked behind me and noticed that the vehicle the subject appeared to have come from was still occupied. I approached the vehicle with my gun drawn. I took a quick glance inside and did not see any other weapons. I could see that Officer O'Connor with UPD was covering the two subjects I could see in the car. I returned to where the subject had been shot. The subject was secured in handcuffs for Officer's safety.

I returned to the truck and ordered a [REDACTED] in the rear middle seat out of the vehicle at gunpoint. The [REDACTED] kept saying that I had the wrong vehicle. The subject complied and exited the vehicle. I had him turn and face the vehicle. I holstered my handgun and detained the subject in handcuffs. He was later identified as [REDACTED]. He was placed in Officer Falkenstine's patrol vehicle.

Officer O'Connor detained the other subject from the rear driver's side seat.

The crowd surrounding the incident had significantly grown in size. I requested mutual aid from all allied agencies. I also requested APD dispatch notify Lt Silvers of the incident.

I began trying to move the crowd back out of the scene of the shooting. The crowd was very

aggressive, shouting at myself and other officers. I kept trying to get voluntary compliance with the crowd to back up and let paramedics tend to the subject. We continued to attempt to have the crowd move back and were later joined by members from the Humboldt County Sheriff's Department, Eureka Police Department, and the California Highway Patrol. At that point, we were able to get the crowd back and taped off an area from the N/W corner of 9th St/H St to the S/W corner of 9th St/H St, along the south sidewalk of the 700 block of 9th St to the front of the Alibi (744 9th St).

While I was conducting crowd control in the area of 9th St and H St, I was approached by a [REDACTED] adult. He told me that he was the driver of the truck that the shooting occurred at. He identified himself by [REDACTED] driver's license as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me the following in summary:

[REDACTED] was standing near his truck. He said a [REDACTED] jumped in his truck and asked for a ride. [REDACTED] asked, "Who are you?" The [REDACTED] answered, "My name is [REDACTED]." [REDACTED] told him [REDACTED] needed a ride. [REDACTED] asked where [REDACTED] needed a ride to, and [REDACTED] told him "Down the road." [REDACTED] said he saw [REDACTED] pull out a pistol. [REDACTED] said, "What the fuck?" [REDACTED] said, "I'm gonna pop him." [REDACTED] said that is when all of the "crazy shit" went down. I confirmed with [REDACTED] that he saw [REDACTED] with a gun, and he confirmed that he did.

At this point of the investigation, I was not sure of the connection between [REDACTED] and the subject with the gun. I detained [REDACTED] in handcuffs and he was placed on the rear seat of an Eureka Police Department vehicle. I would later transport [REDACTED] back to APD for a statement.

Once we had the crime scene established, I instructed Officer Falkenstine to monitor the east perimeter and start a crime scene log. I instructed Officer McKenzie to monitor the west perimeter and keep a crime scene log as well.

I stood by at the scene until Lt SILVERS arrived on scene and I briefed him on what I know. I also briefed Detective Sergeant DOKWEILER.

This report will be attached to the original case.

**SUPPLEMENT 3 - Autopsy**

On 9/10/17 at about 0800 hrs, the autopsy of [REDACTED] was conducted at the Humboldt County Coroner's Office in Eureka, California. The autopsy was attended by Detective Sgt. Dokweiler, Humboldt State University Evidence Technician Zan Mendonca, Medical Assistant Jack Darey, Medical Assistant Kendall Swenson, Coroner Trever Enright, and myself.

Dr. Mark Super was conducting the autopsy. ET Mendonca took evidentiary photographs during the autopsy. I was present during the entire autopsy and witnessed Dr. Super recovering multiple bullets and bullet fragments from [REDACTED] body.

Upon completion of the autopsy, Dr. Super advised me that he had determined cause of death to be a result of multiple gunshot wounds including one gunshot to the heart and right lung. This also explained the lack of a large amount of blood at the scene as the heart would not have been pumping blood out of the multiple gunshot wounds.

I took possession of [REDACTED] clothing, bullets, bullet fragments, and a blood DNA card from Coroner Enright. I transported the evidence to the Arcata Police Department where I booked them into evidence (Items #39-46).

On 9/11/17 at about 1400 hrs, I contacted [REDACTED] via telephone as he had reported to have been a witness to the officer involved shooting on 9/09/17. [REDACTED] was cooperative and agreed to an interview by phone. The following is a summary of that interview:

[REDACTED] told me that on 09/09/17 at about 0120 hrs, he was standing on the north west corner of 9th Street and H Street facing east towards the front of the bars down the north side of 9th Street.

[REDACTED] heard a commotion and saw a [REDACTED] adult wearing a black sweatshirt and dark pants on the sidewalk in front of the bars. [REDACTED] saw the [REDACTED] holding a pistol in his right hand pointing it south towards the police officers in the area. [REDACTED] told me the [REDACTED] was holding the gun sideways and observed the hand holding the gun jerk and heard a gunshot. [REDACTED] told me that he believes the gun was fired at this time as he had not heard any shots prior to this. [REDACTED] told me that based on what he observed, he believes that the [REDACTED] he was watching fired the first shot. [REDACTED] then heard multiple more gunshots but couldn't tell who was firing at that time.

[REDACTED] could not provide any further information at this time. It should be noted that the description [REDACTED] provided matched the clothing worn by [REDACTED] that night. [REDACTED] witness account was consistent with other witness accounts of the events that night.

On 9/9/17, at approximately 0140 hours, I was dispatching at the time of an officer involved shooting. At 0203 hours, I responded to the scene in full uniform, per Sergeant Altizer's request.

Sergeant Altizer requested I respond to Mad River Community Hospital where the suspect was transported by ambulance.

Upon my arrival I was directed by MRCH personnel to the first room in the Emergency Room. The suspect, who was later identified as [REDACTED] was lying on a hospital bed with a sheet covering him. I was advised by hospital staff that [REDACTED] was deceased.

[REDACTED] pants, which had been cut off of [REDACTED] were on the floor of the hospital room as were [REDACTED] shoes and one sock. A bullet was lying next to [REDACTED] pants. I asked one of the nurses at the hospital when the bullet had fallen on the floor and from where and was told that they did not see the bullet fall to the floor and only noticed it after [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased.

I was advised by a hospital employee, [REDACTED], he believed there was a wallet in [REDACTED] pants. He told me he had not touched it but could feel the weight of it when he had placed the pants on the ground. Prior to retrieving the wallet, I took photographs of the hospital room and later provided the camera to Detective Sergeant Dokweiler. I then found [REDACTED] wallet in the right front pocket of [REDACTED] pants and located [REDACTED] ID card. I logged [REDACTED] information with Arcata Communications and placed [REDACTED] wallet on top of [REDACTED] pants.

I contacted Detective Sergeant Dokweiler and updated him. Officer Phinney arrived on scene. He and I were assigned to securing [REDACTED] body and hospital room pending the arrival of the Critical Incident Team and Coroner.

HCSO Investigator Turner arrived on scene to relieve me and took control of the scene along with Officer Phinney (Refer to Officer Phinney's supplemental report "1-Initial Response" for more information).

On 09/09/2017, at approximately 0140 hrs, I was contacted at home by Arcata Police Department (APD) communications notifying me of an officer involved shooting and requesting I respond to the scene.

I left my home and arrived on scene, the 700 Blk of 9th Street at approximately 0215 hrs. I contacted the on-duty watch commander, Sgt. Keith Altizer, and received a briefing of the incident. He advised APD Ofc. Mathew O'Donovan and Humboldt State University Police Officer Louis Altic had engaged a subject who shot a handgun at them. Both officers returned fire striking the subject who was later identified as [REDACTED] Ofc. Altic had sustained a gunshot wound to the right leg, Ofc. O'Donovan was uninjured, and [REDACTED] had been transported to the hospital via ambulance where [REDACTED] was later pronounced dead. Sgt. Altizer requested I assume the investigation.

After surveying the scene I requested Sgt. Hoffman, who arrived on scene from home, take control of the scene and the personnel who remained. I then meet with Lt. Silvers, the APD Operations Commander, and requested he activate the Humboldt County Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT).

A short time later Lt. Silvers informed me he had notified the Humboldt County District Attorney's Office (DA) Chief Investigator Wayne Cox and CIRT notifications were being made. A briefing was scheduled at APD for 0430 hrs.

The CIRT briefing was held and DA Inv. Gary Cooper and I were assigned as co-lead investigators. Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) Det. Sgt. Diana Freese was paired with Eureka Police Department (EPD) Sr. Det. John Gordon to conduct witness interviews. DA Inv. Martin Morris was paired with EPD Det. Rick Bise to conduct witness interviews. EPD Sr. Det. Ron Harpham was paired with HSUPD Evidence Tec. Zan Mendonca to perform evidence collection related to the involved officers. HCSO Inv. Jennifer Turner was paired with APD Ofc. Josh Phinney to collect evidence related to the suspect at the Mad River Community Hospital. California Department of Justice Senior Criminalist Dale Cloutier was paired with California Highway Patrol Inv. Andrew Unsinger. HCSO Det. Hillary Haven and HCSO Dep. Tim Jones conducted a digital scan of the scene.

Each member of the CIRT investigative team later prepared written narratives detailing their respective tasks. Their reports are retained with their employing agencies under outside assist case numbers, and are also scanned into this case as attachments.

On 09/11/2017, at approximately 1515 hrs, DA Inv. Cooper and I met with HSUPD Ofc. Louis Altic and his attorney, [REDACTED] of the [REDACTED] Law Firm, at the Arcata Police Department. The purpose of the meeting was to interview Ofc. Altic regarding the events of 09/09/2017.

I began the interview by confirming with Ofc. Altic that he was here voluntarily and with his legal counsel. He confirmed that was correct and he was willing to provide me with a statement detailing the events of the night of 09/09/2017. I asked Ofc. Altic to tell me about the evening from the beginning of his shift.

The following is a summary of Ofc. Altic's statement:

Ofc. Altic stated he was working a graveyard shift which began at 1900 hrs, on the 09/08/2017 and was scheduled to end at 0700 hrs, on the 09/09/2017. He donned his uniform, prepared his patrol car and then attended briefing. He was working with HSUPD Ofc. Vince O'Connor and learned at briefing he (Altic) had been assigned a civilian ride-along. After briefing he met his ride-along, HSU student [REDACTED] and they left the office and began regular patrol duties.

Ofc. Altic said while patrolling around they conducted a couple traffic stops and performed some security checks. Later in the evening they responded to a party call in the city to assist Arcata officers. As they cleared the party call they heard Arcata officers get dispatched to a group physically fighting on the plaza. The Arcata officers responded "code-3" to the call because it was reported to be in progress. Ofc. Altic said they responded as well in case assistance was needed. When they arrived they parked a short distance away and walked toward the plaza. It appeared the fight had dispersed before they arrived.

Ofc. Altic stated he and his rider were standing on the south side of 9th Street, opposite the bars, when the Arcata officers approached him. While they were standing there talking they were approached by a subject who pointed out a vehicle and said one of the subjects inside had a firearm. The Arcata officers decided they should contact the occupants of the vehicle and they began to move across (north) 9th Street. Ofc. Altic said he obtained the mans name and phone number and wrote it in his notebook.

Ofc. Altic stated it was his recollection the Arcata officers contacted the occupants of the truck ([REDACTED]) at the driver's side doors. It was his recollection he was much closer to the truck and participating in the contact; however, upon reviewing the video just prior to giving this statement he saw he was actually still on the south side of 9th Street facing away from the truck. He recalled hearing someone behind him (near the truck) yell something like "are you looking for me" or "are you looking for this." As he turned he saw a [REDACTED] and he was holding a gun in [REDACTED] right hand. Ofc. Altic stated the [REDACTED] tone was challenging or mocking. It was his impression the [REDACTED] was "posturing" or "posing." The gun was waiving around and pointing in various directions. Ofc. Altic said it was his perception that the [REDACTED] could discharge the gun in his direction or any direction very rapidly and there were many people standing nearby on the plaza and he was instantly afraid of that possibility.

Ofc. Altic stated he reacted to the perceived threat by turning and moving toward the threat as rapidly as he could. As he did this the [REDACTED] began backing up and almost stumbling away. His impression was the [REDACTED] arms went out to try and maintain [REDACTED] balance as [REDACTED] backpedaled away. Ofc. Altic said at that time he was aware of people scattering away from the [REDACTED]. As he ran toward the [REDACTED] he watched [REDACTED] fall

backward, tripping over the curb. When the [redacted] went down [redacted] arms spread wide away from [redacted] body. Ofc. Altic said he continued to run toward the [redacted] hoping her could control the [redacted] gun before [redacted] could recover from falling. Before he could reach the [redacted] he saw the gun swinging back toward him and heard the report and felt an impact near his waist area.

Ofc. Altic explained that as he saw the gun being brought back toward him, he was in fear for his life. As he heard and felt the shot, his gun now drawn, he began firing at the [redacted]. He fired several times from less than feet away as he continued moving toward the subject. Ofc. Altic said his momentum carried him forward until he was almost on top of the [redacted] and he stopped firing when he saw [redacted] hands and the gun fall into [redacted] lap. At that time he felt the threat had stopped and he stopped firing. Ofc. Altic recalled an Arcata officer saying "get the gun." He reached down and grabbed the gun from the [redacted] hand by the top of the slide and backed away. He recalled seeing officers doing CPR and at some point he recalled becoming aware officers were still clearing the truck the suspect had gotten out of. He moved that way to assist and someone asked him if he had been hit. He told them he thought he might be so they directed him to go sit down.

Ofc. Altic said at that time he walked across 9th Street and sat down on the tailgate of a pick-up truck. His rider had been standing near the truck and approached him. While standing next to him his rider passed out just as medical personnel were arriving. He stated a medic helped him toward an ambulance while a second medic assisted his rider.

Ofc. Altic said he was transported to the hospital where they treated him for a bullet wound to the upper right leg near his crotch.

I asked Ofc. Altic if upon arriving at the initial fight call he remembered interacting with anyone. He stated he only recalled talking to the man who provided the initial information about the subject in the truck having a firearm. He went on to say upon watching the video he could see he was talking with someone else but he didn't remember exactly how that occurred. He reiterated his recollection was he had been in a different position, much closer to the truck, but now he wasn't sure. Ofc. Altic said he didn't believe the man in the video was wearing the same clothing as the man he originally spoke to, but he couldn't recall how or why he was talking to the man he saw in the video.

I asked Ofc. Altic if he remembered which officers he had been with at the time. He recalled Ofc. O'Donovan and Ofc. O'Connor had been out with him and he thought a second APD officer but he couldn't recall who.

Ofc. Altic recalled the Arcata officers were contacting someone in the driver's side backseat and the subject began to get out. The officers directed the [redacted] to get back in the truck and he complied. It was shortly after that the [redacted] with the gun got out of the truck from the passenger side rear seat and said what [redacted] said that drew his attention to [redacted].

Ofc. Altic said he was confused and didn't understand why someone would approach police that way. His demeanor made him (Altic) fearful. Ofc. Altic stated it wasn't helpful or cooperative, it was challenging and confrontational. Ofc. Altic stated [redacted] demeanor and the way [redacted] was handling the gun

was "inexplicable" to him.

I asked Ofc. Altic if it was his recollection that there had been two officers contacting the occupants of the truck. He stated prior to watching the video it was his recollection there had been two officers on the driver's side of the truck and he was on the passenger's side. In watching the video however; his position was different than he had recalled. He did recall the truck was a dark colored four door pick-up parked facing north near the "Side Lines (Bar)." He clarified he couldn't say exactly which parking stall, but it was in front of the Side Lines (Bar) or just west of it.

Ofc. Altic recalled he had parked his patrol car on the southeast corner of the intersection of 9th and H Street. He contacted the subject that told officers about the [REDACTED] with gun on the south side of 9th Street and slightly east of the suspect vehicle. Ofc. Altic said his memory was that he moved from that location to somewhere near the back of the suspect vehicle. Ofc. Altic confirmed he was never anywhere north of the back of the suspect vehicle prior to the [REDACTED] exiting with the gun.

I asked Ofc. Altic if he was part of any discussion or planning on how officers intended to contact the occupants of the vehicle. He stated he wasn't, but did recall the Arcata officers say they should probably contact the occupants and it was his recollection they broadcast their intention to contact a subject that possibly had a weapon over the radio. Ofc. Altic confirmed he wasn't exactly sure, other than O'Donovan, which officers had been there. He stated he knew the majority of the Arcata officers, most by name, but a few of the newer ones only by face. Ofc. Altic said he knew Ofc. Falkenstine and Sgt. Altizer, but didn't recall seeing either of them during the incident. It was his understanding Sgt. Altizer was across the Plaza dealing with a man down call.

I asked Ofc. Altic if he had ever had contact with the witness that told him about the [REDACTED] having gun. Ofc. Altic said he didn't believe he had ever seen him before. I asked him if he had ever contacted the suspect ([REDACTED]) before. He stated he didn't believe so and in fact he couldn't even recall what [REDACTED] looked like.

I asked Ofc. Altic if he could explain again his recollection of how he approached the [REDACTED] with the gun. He said it was his recollection he had to round the corner of the truck as he ran toward [REDACTED]. Prior to watching the video he believed he had been closer to the truck, but his impression now was that he had run pretty much straight at [REDACTED]. He explained he thought [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) had appeared at the back of the truck and so he (Altic) had to round the corner to pursue [REDACTED].

I asked Ofc. Altic what he remembered about other officers approaching the suspect. He stated he only saw the suspect. He heard [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]), turned, saw the gun, and began running toward [REDACTED] while drawing his weapon. He did recall seeing an estimated 50-100 people, mostly in front of the bars prior to the incident. As he ran toward the suspect he was aware of people scattering to either side as the suspect was backing up. Ofc. Altic added that was one reason he didn't shoot sooner. He stated the time of the incident was around 0200 hrs, closing time for the bars, and he categorized it as a pretty normal crowd for a Saturday night at that time.

Eureka Police Department for about 13 years prior to that.

I asked Ofc. Altic what his perception of the [redacted] movements as [redacted] was backing up had been. He stated at first [redacted] seemed to be kind of "swaggering", but as [redacted] backed up [redacted] began almost staggering. As [redacted] continued back [redacted] arms were out and [redacted] appeared to be trying to catch [redacted] balance before hitting the curb and going down to the sidewalk. Ofc. Altic recalled the [redacted] facing him the entire time as [redacted] staggered backward. Ofc. Altic theorized the staggering could have been the result of intoxication, but he wasn't sure. Ofc. Altic said as the [redacted] staggered back the gun was pointed any number of direction before [redacted] ultimately fell backwards onto the sidewalk. Ofc. Altic said he didn't have a memory of the [redacted] pointing the gun at him initially, likely because his back was turned. When he turned around his impression was the [redacted] was gesturing with the gun pointing in the direction of any number of people. When [redacted] fell, it was his recollection, [redacted] arms went out to [redacted] sides and the gun was pointed west. As he approached the [redacted] was swinging the gun inward toward him and [redacted] ([redacted]) ultimately shot [redacted]

I asked Ofc. Altic what his perception was as he saw the gun swinging in his direction. He stated he absolutely thought [redacted] was pointing it at him. He went on to say he was close enough at that point there was nothing else there but him (Altic). He believed he was within about five feet when the suspect fired. He stated he could feel the concussion of the suspects gun going off and he began firing as well, ending up within hands reach of the suspect. Ofc. Altic said it was his recollection that he fired his gun just after he was hit by the suspects bullet. Ofc. Altic said he wasn't sure how many times he fired but he thought probably about five times. He couldn't recall being aware of any other gun fire aside from his and the suspects ([redacted]). He remembered hearing shouting but didn't know whose. The only shot he was actually aware the suspect fired was the one that hit him. Ofc. Altic said he was sure about the feeling he had of being shot and that then he (Altic) fired several times, but beyond that he wasn't sure.

I asked Ofc. Altic what he thought the suspects intention was when [redacted] moved the gun toward him. He stated the only thing he knew was it was a threat and he couldn't stop the one round that the suspect had already fired. He stated he didn't want to fire and he thought he could get to the gun before [redacted] fired and control it, but he was a step or two late.

Inv. Cooper clarified with Ofc. Altic that it was his belief he could grab the gun from the suspect. Ofc. Altic stated he thought he could get close enough he could control it or block it.

Ofc. Altic said the manner in which the suspect was acting and waiving the gun around, it didn't appear [redacted] had any concern for other peoples safety and he didn't know what [redacted] was going to do. While he was afraid for his own safety he was concerned for the other people around and he viewed the suspects actions as a threat. Ofc. Altic said he had been involved in other incidents that resulted in police shooting, but he had never been the shooter. He had been in numerous situations with armed subjects, but this one was different.

When asked if he believed the suspect knew he was there when [redacted] exited the vehicle and pointed the gun in his direction, Ofc. Altic said he was sure [redacted] did and he felt confident [redacted] knew he was a police officer. He couldn't be sure if the suspects statements were directed solely at him, but [redacted] was looking directly at

directly at him when [redacted] said it and he felt they were directed at him.

I asked Ofc. Altic if in hindsight, there was anything he would do differently. He stated there wasn't from the time he heard the suspects voice. He went on to say he had many reasons he didn't shoot sooner, even though now he wished he had and avoided being shot. He also said he wished they (officers) would have worked out more of a plan prior to approaching the vehicle, but they go to that type of call routinely. He said it wasn't uncommon for people to say all kinds of things to get the police jacked up so you never really know how credible a report is. He stated he didn't fault anyone and they had plenty of backup and additional officers at the scene.

On 09/09/2017, at approximately 0545 hrs, HCDA Inv. Gary Cooper and I meet with [REDACTED] in the APD interview room. [REDACTED] was on a civilian ride-a-long with HSUPD Ofc. Altic at the time of the officer involved shooting.

The following is a summary of her statement:

[REDACTED] said her night began around 1900 hrs, when she was assigned to Ofc. Altic to do a ride-a-long. She described the evening as being "awesome" and she was getting a lot of good information from Ofc. Altic. Late in the evening they went to assist the APD with a loud party call. Shortly after that they heard there was a fight going on in the square so they went to assist with that. By the time they arrived there was nobody fighting, so they decided to "hang out" on the plaza for awhile.

While standing on the plaza they were approached by a "guy" that told them the person with the gun was inside a truck parked across the way. The man said the [REDACTED] had been pointing the gun around saying "do you want some of this, do you want some of this."

The officers then went across the street and Ofc. Altic told her to stay there (on the south side of 9th Street). The officers approached the left side of the truck to search it and that was when the [REDACTED] got out of the right side with a gun. The [REDACTED] started running back and fired [REDACTED] gun and that was when the officers started running toward [REDACTED] and shot back at [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] went down to the ground in the fetal position and she could hear officers yelling "cuff [REDACTED] cuff [REDACTED]."

[REDACTED] said she couldn't see where "Louie" (Ofc. Altic) was at the time of the shooting because there was a vehicle obscuring her view. When she saw him again he was walking toward her. As he got close she could see where he had been shot. She wasn't sure if he realized he was shot and so she told him and another officer told him as well. She said Ofc. Altic came to the south side of 9th Street and sat on the tailgate of a pickup. She stated she asked if he was OK and upon her seeing the blood, she began to feel light headed and short of breath, before ultimately passing out. She was assisted by medical personnel and she passed out a couple more times before calling her room mate to come get her.

I then sketched out a simple diagram of 9th Street and asked [REDACTED] to mark where she was standing when the shooting occurred. She indicated she was standing almost directly across the street standing in the street behind a parked car. She stated once the shooting started she retreated further south behind a car.

[REDACTED] indicated the involved officers were standing on the left (west) side of the truck the suspect got out of. She said the suspect was shooting in a southerly direction. She wasn't able to differentiate between the suspects gun shots and the officers gun shots, but she recalled there being a lot of shots fired. It was her recollection that Ofc. Altic ran directly toward the suspect, but he disappeared from her view behind a car parked along the north curb of 9th Street.

[REDACTED] was unable to recall the suspect saying anything as [REDACTED] exited the vehicle. She did recall somebody saying something about a gun but she wasn't able to recall who said it, an officer or the suspect. The only thing she heard officers say was after the suspect was down one of the officers was saying "put the handcuffs on [REDACTED]" She further clarified she didn't hear any conversation between the

officers and the occupants of the vehicle, either before or after the shooting.

[REDACTED] recalled when they first got there and didn't find a fight, there had been one guy in a maroon beanie that appeared to her to be trying to start fights. She stated the "K-9 officer" (O'Donovan), told the guy multiple times to go home. He eventually left the area. She didn't know if he had been involved with the suspect or not.

[REDACTED] stated she saw the [REDACTED] get out of the truck and point the gun as [REDACTED] was backing up. As soon as she heard [REDACTED] shoot the officers began running after [REDACTED] and returning fire. She couldn't understand why anyone would get out and shoot when there were a bunch of police officers around. In addition there were a lot of people standing around and in the area.

I clarified with [REDACTED] that the suspect was shooting in a southerly direction. She stated it was her feeling the [REDACTED] was shooting at the police officers.

Inv. Cooper clarified with [REDACTED] the officers were all position on the driver's side of the vehicle. She stated they were, but she didn't know who, or if, they were talking to the occupants when the suspect got out of the passenger side rear door. She then stated the officers were talking to one of the occupants outside the truck as well. She theorized Ofc. Altic must have been near the rear of the truck because he was one of the first officers she saw running. She reiterated the suspect definitely started shooting first triggering the officers to run toward [REDACTED] and ultimately shoot their guns.

Inv. Cooper asked [REDACTED] if there was anyone standing right around, or next to her. [REDACTED] wasn't able to recall anyone immediately next to her. Inv. Cooper also asked if she saw anyone videoing the shooting. [REDACTED] said she felt pretty sure someone was videoing the shooting, but she couldn't identify anyone.

  - A. Indeterminate range-type entrance wound, dorsal left wrist.
  - B. Fractures of left carpal bones.
  - C. Exit wound, left thenar eminence.
  - D. Fragment of lead bullet core recovered from fracture site.
  - E. Wound path: back to front, downward, and slightly medial to lateral.


- 11. Laceration of left parietal scalp:
  - A. Small fragment of bullet recovered from hair overlying laceration.
  - B. Wound is possibly shrapnel injury.
- 12. Separate bullet core and jacket, a flattened bullet core, small fragments of jacketing, and a separate mushroomed jacket are recovered from clothing.
- 13. Blunt impact injuries:
  - A. Ovoid abrasions (two) of right anterior chest.
  - B. Abrasions on dorsal left hand.
  - C. Superficial abrasion of left lower back.
  - D. Abrasion-puncture wound of left jaw.

**CAUSE OF DEATH: Gunshot wounds of chest and extremities.**

**OPINION:** The atypical entrance wound of the anterior left chest (labeled C) probably represents a re-entrance wound from one of the wounds exiting the left arm, likely the forearm wound but possibly the wrist wound.

**IDENTIFICATION:**

The body is received encased in a red vinyl body bag. The zipper pulls are connected by red evidence tape. The subject's name and coroner's case number are written on the outside of the bag in black marker ink. A white sheet partially covers the body inside the body bag. The body is supine but the hands are handcuffed behind the back. Brown paper bags have been previously placed on the hands, secured with adhesive tape. These will be retained.

**EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL INTERVENTION:**

An oropharyngeal airway exits the mouth. Disposable defibrillator pads are adhered to the right pectoral area and left chest. EKG pads are distributed about the anterior torso. A hospital-type identification bracelet encircles the right wrist labeled simply with the number [REDACTED]. An intraosseous needle exits the anterior left lower leg near the knee, secured by tape and gauze. The paper backs from some EKG pads litter the body.

**CLOTHING:**

The following clothing items are on or about the body:

1. A cutaway black hoodie pushed aside exposing the anterior torso. On the front is a photograph of a man holding a phone above the name DEZZY. On the back is a design that reads #FREEDEZZY. A stitch-like horizontal grouping of multiple gunshot defects extends from the lateral right sleeve across the anterior sleeve onto the front. Six separate holes make up this grouping. On the lower mid-front is a cluster of three ovoid apparent gunshot defects. On the left upper front are three apparent gunshot defects. On the left sleeve is a gunshot defect near the shoulder seam and another is on the posterior elbow area. The hood area is stained by tan-yellow emesis. Two more gunshot defects are seen on the left sleeve near the cuff. Both sleeves are partially cutaway. Another gunshot defect is on the right upper back near the shoulder. Upon removal of the hoodie, portions of what appear to be two bullets fall out. This consists of a mushroomed copper bullet jacket with a separate mushroomed lead core, another fragment of flattened lead core, and two small fragments of copper jacketing.
2. A cutaway black tee-shirt that has a leopard skin design on the front, and what appears to be an Aztec calendar surrounded by the words LOST KINGS. A gunshot defect is along the

right sleeve cuff. This garment has also been pushed aside exposing the anterior torso. Emesis stains are on the front. A gunshot defect is on the anterior left sleeve. Adhered to the inner surface of the left sleeve near the cuff is a mushroomed portion of bullet jacketing material.

### EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The partially clothed, unembalmed body is that of a normally developed, adequately nourished, [REDACTED] who appears consistent with the reported age of [REDACTED] years. The body measures [REDACTED] inches long and weighs approximately [REDACTED] pounds. Rigor mortis is fully developed in the cold body. Lividity appears to be posterior, but is faint and difficult to assess due to [REDACTED]. Tan granular emesis is in the nose and mouth. Dried blood stains the back of the left hand and is on the skin around some of the gunshot wounds described below.

The scalp hair is [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that are approximately [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] consists of a sparse [REDACTED]. The irides are [REDACTED] and the corneas are [REDACTED]. The sclerae and conjunctivae are [REDACTED]. No scleral hemorrhages or conjunctival petechiae. No peri-orbital cutaneous petechiae. The ears, nose and mouth are free of foreign material. The nasal skeleton and facial bones are palpably intact. The lips are uninjured. The teeth are natural and in fair condition with a peculiar wide gap between the upper central incisors. Each ear lobe is [REDACTED].

The neck is stable and symmetric. There are no marks or gunshot wounds on the neck.

The chest is stable and symmetric. No palpable subcutaneous emphysema. Gunshot injuries of the chest are described below. On the skin over the clavicular area from shoulder to shoulder is a [REDACTED].

The abdomen is flat and soft. No abdominal surgical scars. The [REDACTED] are those of a [REDACTED] adult [REDACTED] with [REDACTED].

The left arm exhibits traumatic angularity due to multiple gunshot wounds described below. No malformations of the extremities. The fingernails are uninjured and extend well beyond the fingertips. The nail beds appear pale. No clubbing of the digits. No hesitation-type scars on the wrists. No needle tracks. Horizontal track-like perimortem compression marks encircle each wrist consistent with handcuff marks. No [REDACTED] on the extremities. The legs show no evidence of peripheral edema. On the anterior right lower leg is an ovoid 1.5 cm remote scar. The toenails are not dystrophic.

The posterior torso and anus are without nontraumatic abnormalities.

**EVIDENCE OF INJURY:**

**1. Gunshot wound of chest:** On the anterior left mid-chest is an atypical gunshot wound of entrance (labeled C) situated 2 cm to the left of mid-sternum, 8.5 cm medial to and 7.5 cm inferior to the left nipple, 51.5 cm from the top of the head. The wound consists of an ovoid 0.8 cm hole with a wide surrounding marginal abrasion measuring 1.2 cm in diameter. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the anterior left chest and perforates lower left costal cartilages just lateral to the xiphoid. The wound path perforates the pericardial sac and lacerates the right margin of the heart resulting in a gaping laceration of the right ventricular free wall. The wound path then exits the back wall of the pericardium through a gaping hole and perforates the right lower lung lobe from anteromedial to posteromedial. The right chest cavity is partially filled with liquid and coagulated blood. The wound path exits the right chest cavity through a perforating fracture of the 10<sup>th</sup> rib, posteriorly, with associated fresh hemorrhage and then penetrates into the subcutaneous soft tissues of the right upper back where a medium to large caliber bullet with copper-colored jacketing and a mushroomed nose (**Bullet #3**) is recovered. The mushroomed nose has a discrete flower petal pattern and the base of the bullet is not completely covered by jacketing. The bullet is recovered at a point 7 cm to the right of mid-spine, 49 cm from the top of the head. The path of the wound is oriented front to back, left to right at approximately 20-30 degrees and slightly upward at approximately 20 degrees.

**2. Gunshot wound of left lower back:** On the lower left back is an atypical gunshot wound of entrance (labeled N) situated 7 cm to the left of mid-spine, 74 cm from the top of the head. The wound consists of a 3 x 1 cm, ovoid oblong graze-type laceration that enters at the superior/medial end. The wound path stays within the subcutaneous soft tissue coursing upward and to the right. The wound path penetrates subcutis and extra-thoracic muscle and then impacts the posterior aspect of the right 10<sup>th</sup> rib laterally. The wound path continues on into the deep posterior extra-thoracic soft tissues of the right back where a medium to large caliber bullet with copper-colored jacketing and a slightly distorted nose is recovered (**Bullet #4**). This bullet has a completely jacketed base. The bullet is recovered at a point within extra thoracic soft tissues of the back, 3 cm lateral to and 2 cm inferior to the bullet recovered from Gunshot Wound #1. The 23 cm long wound path is oriented straight left to right and upward at approximately 45 degrees.

**3. Gunshot wound of left hip:** On the posterolateral left thigh over the hip is gunshot wound of entrance (labeled T) situated 5 cm lateral to the mid-sagittal plane of the leg, 91.5 cm from the top of the head. The wound consists of an ovoid 1 cm hole that has a very thin marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or

muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the posterior left hip area and courses forward and upward through soft tissue. The wound path penetrates into the subcutaneous soft tissues of the lower mid-abdomen where a medium to large caliber bullet (**Bullet #2**) with a mushroomed nose and completely jacketed base is recovered at a point 6 cm directly below the umbilicus, 77 cm from the top of the head. A clump of black fabric is found in the pit in the center on the mushroomed nose. The wound path does not penetrate into the peritoneal cavity. The path of the wound is oriented left to right, upward at approximately 30 degrees, and back to front at approximately 30-45 degrees.

**4. Gunshot wound of buttocks:** On the medial lower aspect of the left buttock is a gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **S**) situated 2.5 cm to the left of the gluteal cleft, 88 cm from the top of the head. The wound consists of a horizontal ovoid 1.5 x 0.8 cm graze-type defect with the entrance at the medial end. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates skin and subcutis but immediately exits the left wall of the gluteal cleft through a 1 x 1.5 cm irregular laceration (labeled **R**). The exit wound is surrounded by an irregular abrasion. The wound path immediately re-enters the right buttock through the medial wall of the gluteal cleft resulting in an irregular 1.5 cm hole (labeled **Q**), 88cm from the top of the head. The hole is surrounded by wide circumferential abrasion. The wound path then courses through deep soft tissues of the right buttock and penetrates into the subcutaneous soft tissues of the right lateral thigh where a medium to large caliber bullet with copper-colored jacketing that has a completely jacketed base and a mushroomed nose is recovered. The bullet is recovered anterior to the mid-coronal plane of the right thigh, 17.5cm inferior to the umbilicus (**Bullet #1**). The 26 cm long wound path of the wound is oriented left to right, back to front at approximately 30 degrees, and upward at approximately 20-30 degrees.

**5. Gunshot wound of right buttock:** On the lower aspect of the right buttock is a gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **P**) situated 9 cm to the right of the gluteal cleft, 89 cm from the top of the head. The wound consists of an ovoid 1 cm hole with very thin marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. The entrance hole is beveled along the medial/inferior edge. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the right buttock coursing sharply to the right. The wound path exits and then immediately re-enters the lower lateral aspect of the right buttock resulting in an elongated oblong 3.7 x 1.5 cm hole (labeled **O**) with eccentric abrasion along the lateral edge and short tears along the side of the laceration that point laterally. The wound path then courses through subcutaneous soft tissues of the right hip area and penetrate into the subcutaneous soft tissues of the right hip where a medium to large caliber bullet with copper-colored jacketing that has a completely jacketed base and slightly

mushroomed nose (**Bullet #5**) is recovered. The bullet is recovered in the mid-coronal plane of the leg, slightly above the hip joint, 81 cm from the top of the head. The 10cm long path of the wound is oriented left to right, upward at approximately 45 degrees and very slightly back to front at approximately 10-20 degrees.

**6. Perforating gunshot wound of left thigh:** On the posterior left thigh is gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **U**) situated in the mid-sagittal plane of the thigh, 79 cm above the heel. The wound consists of an ovoid 1 cm hole that has a thin circumferential marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The 16 cm long wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the posterior left thigh and impacts the inferior edge of the left ischial tuberosity passing posterior to the femur without fracture. The wound path exits the anteromedial left thigh through a crescentic 2 cm laceration (labeled **K**). The exit wound is situated in the mid-coronal plane of the thigh, 34 cm below the umbilicus. No projectile is recovered. The 16cm wound path is oriented back to front, lateral to medial at approximately 30-45 degrees, and slightly downward at approximately 20 degrees.

**7. Perforating gunshot wound of right upper arm:** On the medial aspect of the right upper arm is a gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **D**) situated in the mid-coronal plane of the arm, 19 cm from the tip of the right shoulder. The wound consists of an elongated 4 cm long x 0.9cm wide graze wound that enters at the superior end through an ovoid 1.5 cm hole. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the medial upper arm and passes through the upper arm coursing posterior to the humerus without impact. The wound path then exits the posterolateral left upper arm through a 2 x 1.5 cm tripolar laceration (labeled **M**). The exit wound is situated posterior to the mid-coronal plane of the upper arm, 8 cm below the tip of the right shoulder. No projectile is recovered. The 16 cm long wound path of the wound is oriented upward, medial to lateral at approximately 30 degrees, and front to back at approximately 30 degrees.

**8. Perforating gunshot wound of left upper arm:** On the lateral left upper arm is a gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **I**) situated in the mid-coronal plane of the upper arm, 12 cm above the point of the left elbow and 22 cm below the point of the left shoulder. The wound consists of an ovoid 1.2 cm hole that has a thin circumferential marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the left upper arm and impacts the left humerus at mid-shaft resulting in comminuted fractures with mild surrounding soft tissue hemorrhage. Several fragments of bullet including a fragment of copper-colored jacketing that has a talon-shaped tip is recovered from within the fracture site. The wound path exits the anteromedial left upper arm through a 2 x 1.5 cm gaping stellate laceration (labeled **G**).

The exit wound is situated medial to the mid-sagittal plane of the arm, 17 cm below the point of the left shoulder. No other portion of projectile is recovered. The 10 cm long wound path is oriented lateral to medial, upward at approximately 45 degrees, and posterior to anterior at approximately 20-30 degrees.

**9. Perforating gunshot wound of left forearm:** On the dorsal ulnar left forearm is gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **H**) situated on the dorsal left forearm slightly medial to the mid-sagittal plane of the arm, 16 cm inferior to the point of the elbow. The wound consists of an ovoid 0.9 cm hole with a thin circumferential marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the dorsal ulnar left forearm and impacts the mid-shaft of the radius resulting in comminuted fractures with only mild surrounding hemorrhage. Fractures of lead bullet core and copper-colored jacketing that include a talon-shaped tip are recovered from the fracture site. The wound path exits the ventral left forearm through a 4 x 2.6 cm, gaping irregular laceration (labeled **F**). The exit wound is situated in the mid-sagittal plane of the forearm, 15 cm below the point of the elbow. No other portion of projectile is recovered. The 7.5 cm long wound path is oriented posterior to anterior, horizontal and slightly lateral to medial at approximately 20 degrees.

**10. Perforating gunshot wound of left wrist:** On the dorsal left wrist is a gunshot wound of entrance (labeled **E**) situated in the mid-sagittal plane of the arm over the wrist joint. The wound consists of an ovoid 0.9 cm hole with a thin circumferential marginal abrasion giving it a punched-out appearance. No soot deposition, gunpowder stippling or muzzle imprint is seen. The wound path perforates the skin and subcutis of the dorsal left wrist and impacts carpal bones resulting in marked comminuted fractures of many carpal bones, but sparing the distal radius and ulna, and sparing the metacarpals. There is only mild surrounding associated hemorrhage. A single fragment of lead bullet core is recovered from this fracture site. The wound path exits the left thenar eminence through a 1.5 x 1 cm stellate laceration (labeled **J**). No other portion of projectile is recovered. The 7.5 cm wound path is oriented posterior to anterior, proximal to distal at approximately 45 degrees, and slightly medial to lateral at approximately 20 cm.

**11. Laceration of left parietal scalp:** On the left parietal scalp is a ragged, somewhat horizontal, 3 x 0.7 cm laceration (labeled **L**). The superior and inferior edges are widely abraded. The laceration extends through skin and subcutis but is mostly just superficial. Found in the hair overlying this wound is a small fragment of lead core of a bullet.

**Blunt impact injuries:** On the skin over the right sternoclavicular joint is a 2.2 x 1.2 cm ovoid abrasion with focal excoriation (labeled **A**). The abrasion is situated 8 cm above and 6 cm medial to the right nipple, 5 cm to the right of mid-sternum, and 35.5 cm from the top of the head.

Just above the right nipple is a 2.5 x 1 cm ovoid abrasion (labeled **B**) situated 3.5 cm directly above the right nipple, 12 cm to the right of mid-sternum and 40.5 cm from the top of the head.

Small abrasions are over the dorsal PIP joints of all of the left fingers except the thumb. On the left lower back is a 6 x 1 cm obliquely-oriented abrasion oriented from upper medial to lower lateral.

A tiny abrasion/superficial puncture wound is along the left jawline.

### INTERNAL EXAMINATION

#### HEAD:

The scalp is reflected after making the usual intermastoid incision and is free of subcutaneous or subgaleal hemorrhages. The calvarium is intact. No epidural or subdural hemorrhages. The brain weighs 1385 grams and is of the usual configuration covered by glistening transparent leptomeninges with clear cerebrospinal fluid. The vessels at the base of the brain pursue their usual anatomic courses and are patent throughout without significant atherosclerosis, thrombosis, or aneurysms. No evidence of coning or herniation. Recent or remote traumatic lesions or other abnormalities are not noted on serial coronal sectioning in the fresh state. The ventricular system is symmetric and free of blood. No lesions are seen in the mid brain, brain stem or cerebellum. The bones at the base of the skull are without evidence of fracture. The atlanto-occipital membrane is intact.

#### NECK:

The hyoid bone and laryngeal cartilages are intact with immobile joints. The larynx and trachea are unobstructed and lined by pink-tan mucosa covered by a thin layer of gray-tan foam. No laryngeal mucosal edema. No anterior cervical soft tissue hemorrhage. The cervical spine is intact. No anterior prevertebral fascia hemorrhage.

#### BODY CAVITIES:

See above under "Evidence of Injury". The body cavities are entered in the usual manner. Testing for free air in the pleural cavities is negative. The right chest cavity contains 2000 ml of liquid and coagulated blood. The pericardial sac contains a small amount of bloody fluid but has large perforations both anterior and posterior due to gunshot. The left chest cavity and

peritoneal cavities are free of excess or abnormal fluid accumulations. All cavities are free of adhesions. The organs are in their usual anatomic locations. Both lungs are partially expanded. Serosal surfaces are smooth and glistening.

**CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:**

See above under "Evidence of Injury". The heart weighs 315 grams and is of the usual configuration covered by smooth glistening epicardium. No epicardial petechiae. There is a 7cm long, large gaping laceration of the right ventricular free wall that extends across the base into the right atrium. The edges of this laceration are hemorrhagic. Otherwise, sections show firm red-brown fibrillar myocardium without recent or remote infarcts. The heart walls are not thickened. The endocardium is thin and translucent. The heart valves are normally formed, pliable and intact although the tricuspid valve is injured by gunshot. No vegetations. The coronary ostia are in their usual locations and are patent. The coronary circulation is left dominant. The coronary arteries are free of atherosclerosis and patent throughout, without thrombosis. The aorta is intact and free of atherosclerosis. No complicated plaques or aneurysms. The vena cava and pulmonary arteries are free of antemortem thrombus. The heart and great vessels contain scant residual blood with rare postmortem clots.

**RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:**

See above under "Evidence of Injury". The lung weights are: right – 230 grams, left – 480 grams. The pleural surfaces are smooth and glistening and the lungs exhibit the usual lobation with moderate anthracotic pigmentation. There is a perforating gunshot wound through the RLL entering the antero-basilar surface and exiting the anterolateral surface. The wound path through the lung is ragged and hemorrhagic. Otherwise, sections of both lungs show soft and crepitant, pale pink-tan cut surfaces that are dry. No focal nontraumatic intrapulmonary lesions. The tracheo-bronchial tree contains bloody fluid but is unobstructed and without mass lesions.

**LIVER AND PANCREAS:**

The liver weighs only 970 grams and is covered by a smooth intact capsular surface with sharp anterior margins. Sections show pale red-brown cut surfaces that display the usual lobular architecture. No focal non-traumatic intraparenchymal lesions. I can easily pass my thumb through 2 cm thick sections. The gallbladder contains approximately 5 ml of thin green bile and the gallbladder mucosa is unremarkable. No stones. The bile passages appear patent. No portal lymphadenopathy. The pancreas is free of fat necrosis, fibrosis or hemorrhages. The pancreas is not injured.

**GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:**

The tongue is without evident injury. The pharynx is unobstructed. The esophagus is intact and lined by gray-tan mucosa. The stomach contains 100 ml of tan-brown mucoid fluid with admixed small fragments of unidentifiable food material. No pill material or peculiar scent is noted. The gastric mucosa is intact and pale gray-tan without ulcers or masses. The duodenum and remainder of the small and large bowels are without evident mucosal abnormality. The colon contains soft green-brown feces without blood. The appendix is present.

**SPLEEN AND LYMPH NODES:**

The spleen weighs 60 grams and is covered by a wrinkled but intact gray-tan capsule. Sections show softened and pale, red-brown parenchyma without focal lesions. No enlargement of mediastinal, lung hilar, mesenteric or para-aortic lymph nodes.

**ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:**

The adrenal glands are free of cortical masses or medullary hemorrhages. The thyroid is of the usual size, shape and consistency. No thyroid cysts or masses. The pituitary gland is unremarkable.

**UROGENITAL SYSTEM:**

The kidneys are of similar size and shape. The kidney weights are: right – 100 grams, left – 110 grams. The capsules strip with ease to reveal smooth cortical surfaces and mottled pallor. Sections show uniform cortical thickness with distinct cortico-medullary junctions. The calices, pelves, and ureters are unremarkable. The bladder contains 30 ml of clear straw-colored urine. The bladder mucosa is unremarkable. The prostate gland is not enlarged.

**MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:**

See above under "Evidence of Injury". The red-brown muscle is firm and without focal nontraumatic abnormalities. Fractures involve ribs, the left humerus, left radius and left carpal bones due to gunshot wounds described above. A superficial impact fracture also involves the right ischial tuberosity due to gunshot. No bony malformations. No visible or palpable fractures of the vertebral column. The abdominal fat averages 1.5 cm in thickness.

### BACKGROUND

On September 9, 2017, Officers Matthew O'Donovan of the Arcata Police Department (APD) and Luis Altic of the Humboldt State University Police Department (UPD) responded to reports of a fight in the area of Toby and Jack's bar on 9<sup>th</sup> Street in Arcata. The officers were unable to locate the subjects. While they were in the area investigating, a bystander reported to an officer that one of the people involved in the fight had brandished a handgun. The bystander pointed out a vehicle believed to be associated with the subject who brandished the handgun. As the officers approached the vehicle, suspect [REDACTED] exited the vehicle and opened fire on the officers; the officers returned fire. During the exchange of gunfire, Officer Altic was shot in the leg and suspect [REDACTED] was shot multiple times. Suspect [REDACTED] was transported from the scene and pronounced dead at a local hospital.

### FIELD ACTIVITIES

I received a call from Acting Assistant Laboratory Director [REDACTED] at approximately 0340 hours on September 9, 2017, informing me of a scene processing request for an officer involved shooting in Arcata, California. I responded to the Arcata Police Department for a briefing at approximately 0515 hours and following the briefing proceeded to the scene at approximately 0530 hours.

I documented the scene through photographs, sketches, and measurements and collected select items of evidence. I was assisted in processing the scene by CHP Investigator Andrew Unsinger. Tim Jones and Hillary Havens of the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) documented the scene with a Leica scanning station. I sealed the suspect's [REDACTED] camper shell and cab for examination at a later date. Documentation and evidence collection completed, I departed the scene at approximately 1040 hours on September 9, 2017.

FIELD ACTIVITIES (continued)*Overall scene description*

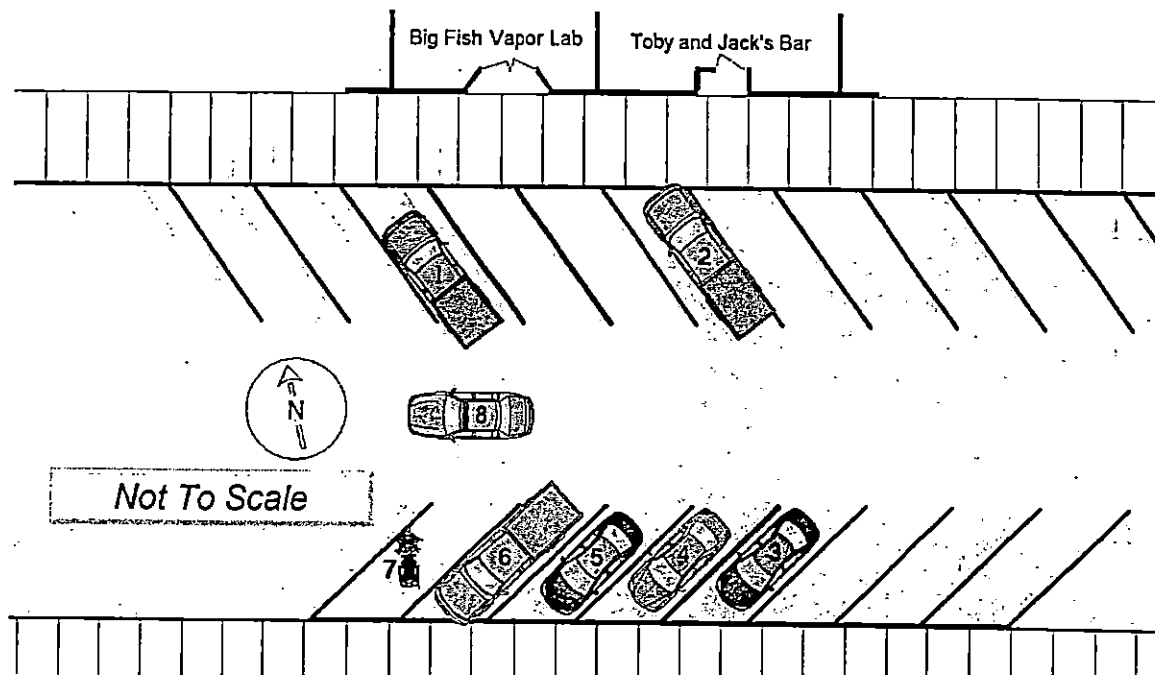


Figure 1: Diagram of scene and vehicles present during scene processing on September 9, 2017. The vehicles consist of the following: (1) suspect's [REDACTED] truck, (2) [REDACTED] truck, (3) [REDACTED] (4) [REDACTED] (5) [REDACTED] (6) [REDACTED] truck, (7) [REDACTED] motorcycle, (8) APD patrol car #321

The scene was located primarily in front of Toby and Jack's bar at 764 9<sup>th</sup> Street in Arcata, California. The bar is located on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street, across from the Arcata Plaza and between G and H Streets. A [REDACTED] truck was parked on the north side of the street, in front of Toby and Jack's door. The suspect's vehicle, a [REDACTED] truck, was also parked on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street, three parking spaces to the west of the [REDACTED] truck. Several vehicles were parked on the south side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street opposite the trucks, including a [REDACTED] truck that Officer Altic was reportedly moved to after he was shot. An APD patrol car was stopped on 9<sup>th</sup> Street between the [REDACTED] and suspect's [REDACTED] trucks. See figure 1 below for a diagram illustrating the overall scene.

*Firearm-related evidence recovered at the scene*

Items 6, 7, 8, 11, and 12 are expended cartridge cases collected from the sidewalk on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street, near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar. Items 6, 7, 8, 11, and 12 each have Winchester "WIN" "40 S&W" head stamps.

Items 2, 3, 4, and 5 are expended cartridge cases collected from the sidewalk on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street, near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar. Item 28 is an expended cartridge case that was recovered from the gutter in front of Toby and Jack's bar, below the [REDACTED] truck. Items 2, 3, 4, 5, and 28 each have Speer "SPEER" "40 S&W" head stamps.

Items 9 and 18 are expended cartridge cases collected from the sidewalk on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street, near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar. Items 9 and 18 both have Federal Premium Ammunition "FC" "NR" "40 S&W" head stamps. "NR" represents "no reload" on some aluminum cartridge cases to indicate that they are not safe to reload.

FIELD ACTIVITIES (continued)

Item 25 is a Smith and Wesson model SD40 VE pistol. The pistol is marked with serial number FWF7981 and is chambered for the 40 Smith and Wesson cartridge. The pistol was recovered from the locked trunk of the APD patrol car #321 stopped on 9<sup>th</sup> Street. As found, pistol's slide was closed and the magazine was in place. An intact cartridge was removed from the chamber and retained as subitem 25a. The magazine was removed from the pistol and retained as subitem 25b. Six intact cartridges were removed from the magazine and retained as subitem 25c. All seven intact cartridges removed from the item 25 Smith and Wesson pistol had Federal Premium Ammunition "FC" "NR" "40 S&W" head stamps.

Item 15 is an expended bullet, item 16 is comprised of two expended bullet jacket fragments, and item 20 is a bullet core fragment. Items 15, 16, and 20 were collected from the sidewalk on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar. Item 21 is approximately half of an expended bullet jacket and item 24 is approximately half of an expended bullet core. Items 21 and 24 were collected from the street between the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] trucks. Item 27 is a bullet core fragment collected from the recessed doorway in front of Big Fish Lounge.

*Biological evidence recovered at the scene*

Representative apparent bloodstains were collected from the sidewalk (item 10) on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar, from 9<sup>th</sup> Street (item 1) on the east side of the [REDACTED] truck, and from the tailgate (item 23) of the [REDACTED] truck.

*Other evidence recovered at the scene*

A cell phone (item 13), cell phone battery (item 19), and a pair of eye glasses (item 14) were collected from the sidewalk on the north side of 9<sup>th</sup> Street near the west end of Toby and Jack's bar. A short stack of cards for K9 Baron (item 22) was collected from the street between the [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] trucks. A single hoop earring (item 26) was collected from the street on the west side of the [REDACTED], near its left front end.

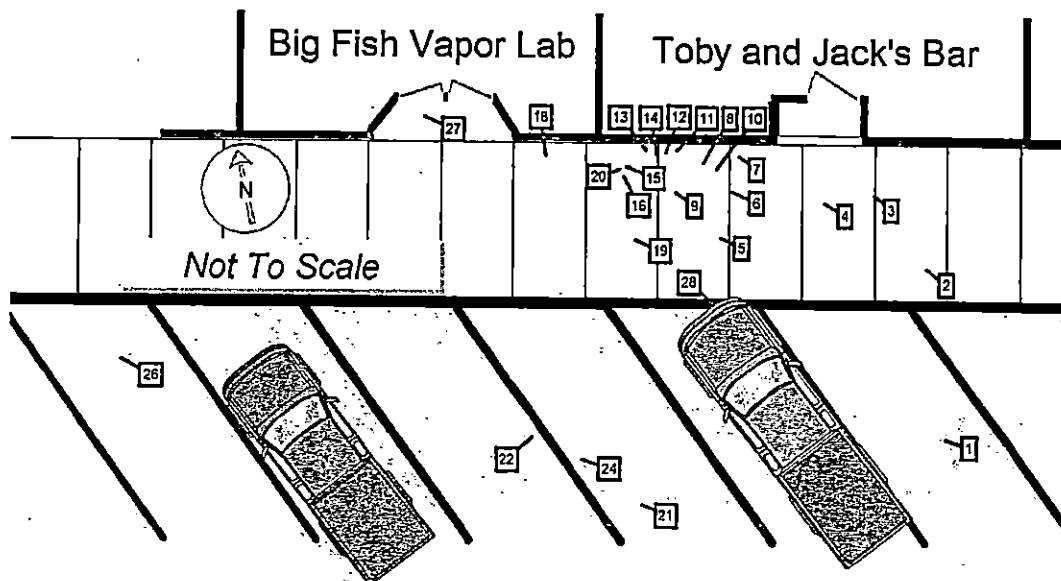


Figure 2: Diagram showing approximate locations of the suspect's [REDACTED] truck (left), [REDACTED] truck (right), and evidence items collected during scene processing on September 9, 2017. Cartridge case items are marked in red, bullets and bullet fragments are marked in green, and biological or other items are marked in blue. No item 17 was marked or collected. Item 23 was collected from the tailgate of the [REDACTED] truck and is not shown in this diagram.

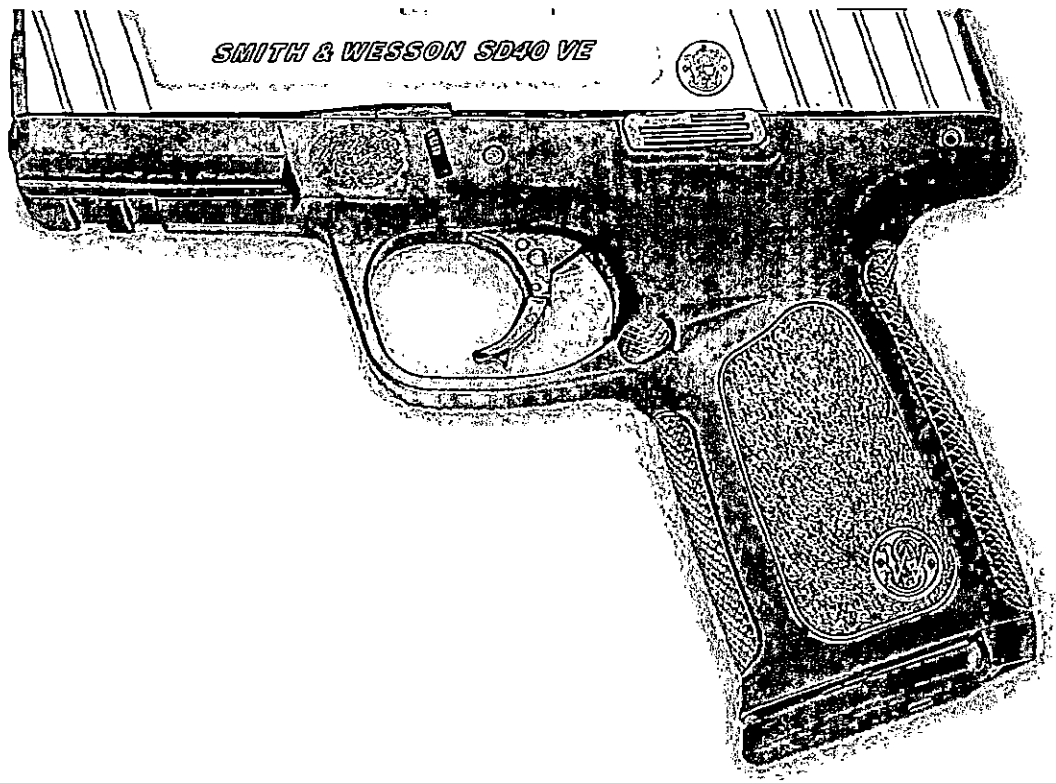



I responded from the City of Fortuna, and arrived at Arcata Police Department at 0400 hours. On arrival I met with Chief Cox, District Attorney Investigator Gary Cooper and Arcata Police Detective Sergeant Todd Dokweiler. I was advised that the CIRT briefing had been pushed back


At 0500 hours, I attended the CIRT briefing, with known information being provided by Det. Sgt. Dokweiler. I was paired with Eureka Police Detective Richard Bise, and assigned to conduct two witness interviews.

The first subject to be interviewed had been transported from the scene of the shooting and was identified by his [REDACTED] Driver's License as [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED].) It should be known that I have interacted with [REDACTED] on multiple occasions in my police career, but had last spoken to him about prior to this event.

Detective Bise and I met with [REDACTED] in an Arcata Police Department interview room at 0519 hours. [REDACTED] was eating some snacks provided to him by the Arcata Police Department and was wearing an Arcata Police Volunteer Jacket because of the cold temperature inside of the interview room. The following is a summary of what [REDACTED] statement:

[REDACTED] said that he had been at the Arcata Police Department since the incident. He confirmed that he had not yet been interviewed. I introduced Detective Bise as being with the Eureka Police Dept., and reminded [REDACTED] that I worked for the District Attorneys' Office, and that we were both there to interview him as members of the Critical Incident Response Team. I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what happened starting from the beginning of when he was with his friends outside Everett's Bar in Arcata.

[REDACTED] said there was "a weird altercation" that happened just prior to the shooting. [REDACTED] said that he and friend were trying to de-escalate the situation. [REDACTED] said that the situation ended abruptly, because the "girls" that were involved left in a vehicle. [REDACTED] said that the police came, and he explained to him that the situation had resolved when the "girls" left. [REDACTED] said that shortly thereafter, he was standing near his truck (a [REDACTED].) [REDACTED] said that a [REDACTED] named "[REDACTED]" was sitting inside the back of his ([REDACTED]) truck with several other men. [REDACTED] said that the police came around the sides of the truck and began asking the subjects inside for their identification. [REDACTED] said he was just standing on the sidewalk and "didn't really know what was going on." [REDACTED] said that he then heard a bunch of screaming, which drew his attention. [REDACTED] said he looked over to see "[REDACTED]" falling backward with a gun in [REDACTED] hand. [REDACTED] said that he saw a muzzle flash from "[REDACTED]" gun. fired, but was certain [REDACTED] fired at least one. [REDACTED] said he saw "[REDACTED]" shoot the officer as "[REDACTED]" was falling backward. [REDACTED] said that the [REDACTED] then went to a party in McKinleyville and were there for a while. [REDACTED] said that the party in McKinleyville wasn't very good, so the group decided to come back to another party they knew about in Arcata. [REDACTED] said that as soon as they got to the Arcata party, the police were already there breaking it up. [REDACTED] said that there was supposed to be a party in Eureka, but it turned out that nothing was going on in Eureka. [REDACTED] said that the group then wanted to return to the plaza to go to the bars there. [REDACTED] said that when traveling from Eureka to Arcata, [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) was in the front passenger seat, "[REDACTED]" ([REDACTED]), "the [REDACTED] kid" ([REDACTED]) and [REDACTED] were all in the rear passenger seats. I asked [REDACTED] about this, and he explained that he thought he heard "[REDACTED]" yell something to the effect of "I'm gonna pop em" just prior to shooting at the officers. I asked [REDACTED] to go over what he witnessed with me again. I asked [REDACTED] what the first thing was that drew his attention. [REDACTED] said that he heard someone say "whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa", then he heard "[REDACTED]" say something like "I'm gonna pop him." upon the direction "[REDACTED]" weapon was pointing when it fired. At about this time [REDACTED] got up from his seat to help visually describe what he had witnessed. [REDACTED] extended his right arm as if it were holding a gun, lifted and extended his left leg and shifted his weight backwards onto the ball of his right foot, simulating "[REDACTED]" motion of falling backward. [REDACTED] said that he thought a bullet from "[REDACTED]" gun probably hit the officer in the leg based upon where it was pointing. [REDACTED] said that after the scene was secured, he approached an officer and explained that he had witnessed the incident, and that the truck inside the scene was his. Detective Bise asked [REDACTED] if he could describe the weapon that "[REDACTED]" was holding. [REDACTED] said that the weapon was "blackish brown" and that "[REDACTED]" was holding it in [REDACTED] right hand. [REDACTED] said "but it happened so fast." I asked [REDACTED] what the duration of the time was between when heard "whoa whoa whoa" and when the shots stop. [REDACTED] said that it lasted "no more than 10 seconds if not even quicker than that." Detective Bise asked what the distance between "[REDACTED]" and the officer was. [REDACTED] said it was about three or four feet. [REDACTED] said that he couldn't believe what was happening, and that he "didn't know what could possibly be going through that [REDACTED] head. [REDACTED] must have wanted to die or something." [REDACTED] said "it's not every day that a [REDACTED] pulls out a gun on a police officer surrounded by other police officers. It's fucking stupid."

While further explaining the incident [REDACTED] mentioned that he hadn't had anything to drink all night. [REDACTED] explained that he doesn't drink and was the designated driver for the group. [REDACTED] said he hadn't been out in a while, but was celebrating because he had just gotten a new job that he starts on 09/11/2017. Detective Bise asked [REDACTED] how drunk the other people he was there with were. [REDACTED] said they "couldn't pass a DUI test but that they weren't completely shit faced." [REDACTED] said he hadn't seen anyone take any hard drug, but that he did witness a little bit of pot smoking. [REDACTED] did not indicate who he had witnessed smoking pot.

Prior to concluding our interview with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] provided his consent for officers to search his pickup truck and the cellular telephone he had in his pocket. [REDACTED] vehicle was inside the police crime scene tape, so he was unable to drive it home. [REDACTED] arranged for his mother to pick him up, but she was unfamiliar with the location of the Arcata Police Department. Because of this I allowed [REDACTED] to retain his telephone until his mother arrived in case she needed further directions.

Detective Bise and I then interviewed [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED].) Detective Bise led this interview, and drafted a report of its contents. While this interview was being conducted, [REDACTED] mother "[REDACTED]" arrived, and I failed to retain [REDACTED] cellular telephone prior to his departure.

At about 0700 hours, I transported [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] from the Arcata Police Dept. back to their residence in [REDACTED]. At about 1417 hours, I called [REDACTED] and advised him that I needed to obtain his telephone. [REDACTED] advised me that he was now in [REDACTED]. We arranged for [REDACTED] to provide his telephone on the evening ours of 09/10/2017.



**NARRATIVE**

On 09-12-2017 at approximately 1247 hours Detective Dokweiler and I met with Officer O'Donovan and his attorney [REDACTED] at Arcata Police Department. We were meeting to obtain Officer O'Donovan's statement in regard to the officer involved shooting which he had an active part in. The following is a summary of his statement.

He said he was dispatched to a fight in progress in front of the Everett's Club. When he arrived, he was told by a bystander all the parties involved had left. While on scene Humboldt State Police Officers Altic and O'Conner, (who were also on scene) were approached by an unknown witness who told him a [REDACTED] was in a truck and had been waving a firearm around. The unknown witness pointed the truck out to Officers Altic and O'Donovan. The witness said the [REDACTED] was still in the truck in the back seat. Officer Altic continued to talk to the witness while Officers O'Donovan and O'Conner walked over to the driver's side of the truck. O'Donovan said he talked with a male subject who was sitting in the back left rear passenger seat of the truck. While asking him about a person inside the truck with a gun, Officer O'Donovan saw the right rear passenger side door of the truck open. O'Donovan said he heard a commotion near the rear of the truck. He walked back to the rear of the truck and saw Officer Altic who appeared to be getting ready to engage in a foot pursuit. He said Officer Altic had his gun out. As he came around the right rear corner of the truck he saw [REDACTED] on the ground.

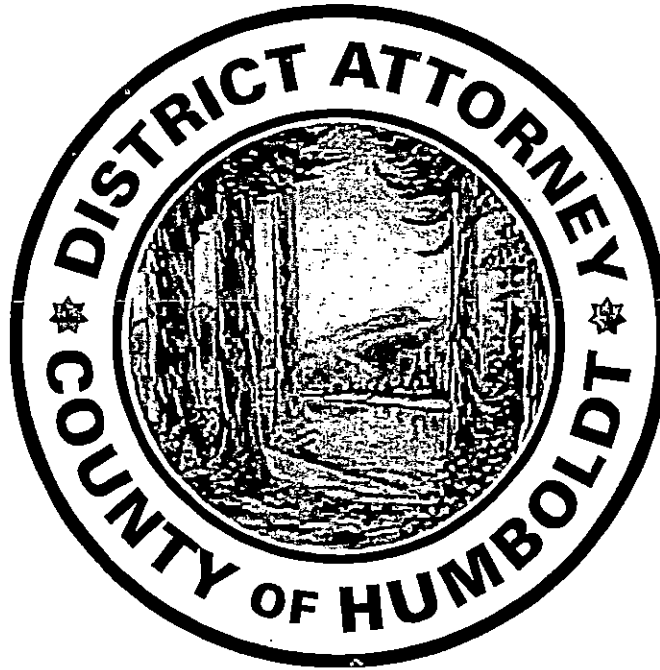

We have completed our review of the investigation into the law-enforcement-officer-involved shooting that resulted in the death of [REDACTED] in September, 2017. The review included video recordings, autopsy and toxicology reports, and the report of the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT), a team of local law enforcement agency personnel trained to investigate officer-involved injuries and deaths. The CIRT for this investigation included employees of the Eureka Police Department, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, Humboldt County District Attorney's Office, California Highway Patrol, the California Department of Justice Bureau of Forensic Services Laboratory, Arcata Police Department and Humboldt State University Police Department.

On September 9, 2017, shortly before 1:30 am, Arcata Police and Humboldt State University Police officers responded to a 911 call reporting a fight adjacent to the bars on the Arcata Plaza. Officers arrived to find that the physical fighting had subsided. They learned from a bystander that he had seen a [REDACTED] exclaim something like, "Who wants some of this?" as [REDACTED] brandished a handgun. That bystander then directed the police to the vehicle the [REDACTED] with the gun had entered.

The dash cam video from the patrol vehicle of Arcata Police Department Officer Kent Falkenstine clearly captured ensuing events. As officers contacted the people in and around the vehicle identified by the bystander, [REDACTED] emerged from the rear passenger seat and pointed a handgun at Humboldt State University Officer Louis Altic. No officer had yet contacted [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] got out of the vehicle and aimed [REDACTED] .40 semi-automatic pistol at Officer Altic. [REDACTED] then fired two shots, one of which struck Officer Altic in the upper thigh,

as he moved rapidly toward [REDACTED] [REDACTED] then stumbled backwards. Officer Altic and Arcata Police Officer Matthew O'Donovan closed to within a few feet of [REDACTED] before returning fire. Eyewitness statements correspond with the video evidence that [REDACTED] fired first. Officer Altic later stated that he quickly advanced on [REDACTED] because he thought closing the distance between himself and [REDACTED] gun might allow him to take control of the assailant's weapon without firing his own.

Detectives interviewed [REDACTED] companions. Each confirmed the report of a preceding fight and claimed ignorance of [REDACTED] possession of a gun until [REDACTED] brandished it just before the shooting started. Additional investigation revealed that [REDACTED] had been sentenced to probation in November, 2016, for felony evasion and the handgun [REDACTED] used in the incident had been stolen. All the evidence collected by a forensic scientist and evidence technicians corresponded with video evidence and eyewitness statements. An autopsy conducted by Dr. Mark Super confirmed that [REDACTED] died of multiple gunshot wounds. Toxicological analysis revealed [REDACTED] had a blood alcohol level of 0.12 and cocaine metabolite in [REDACTED] system.

I have concluded the shooting was legally justified. The applicable legal standard focuses on whether the officers reasonably believed that they were in imminent danger of being killed or suffering great bodily injury. Officer Altic received a bullet wound before he and Officer O'Donovan fired their weapons, removing any doubt about the justification for the actions of the two officers. I have so far been unable to reach [REDACTED] family to inform them of my decision—I would prefer to reach them before my conclusion becomes public information.

The Humboldt County District Attorney's Office has completed review of the investigation into the law-enforcement-officer-involved shooting that resulted in the death of [REDACTED] in September, 2017. The review included video recordings, autopsy and toxicology reports, and the report of the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT), a team of local law enforcement agency personnel trained to investigate officer-involved injuries and deaths. The CIRT for this investigation included employees of the Eureka Police Department, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, Humboldt County District Attorney's Office, California Highway Patrol, California Department of Justice Bureau of Forensic Services Laboratory, Arcata Police Department and Humboldt State University Police Department. A summary of the incident follows.

On September 9, 2017, shortly before 1:30 am, Arcata Police officers responded to a 911 call reporting a fight adjacent to the bars on the Arcata Plaza. Officers arrived to find that the physical fighting had subsided. A bystander reported hearing a [REDACTED] exclaim something like, "Who wants some of this?" as [REDACTED] brandished a handgun. That bystander then directed the police to the vehicle the [REDACTED] with the gun had entered.

The dashcam video from the patrol vehicle of Arcata Police Department Officer Kent Falkenstine clearly captured ensuing events. As officers contacted the people in and around the vehicle identified by the bystander, [REDACTED] emerged from the rear passenger seat and pointed a handgun at Humboldt State University Police Officer Louis Altic. No officer had yet contacted [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] got out of the vehicle and aimed [REDACTED] .40-caliber semi-automatic pistol at Officer Altic. [REDACTED] then fired two shots, one of which struck Officer Altic in the upper thigh, as he moved rapidly toward [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stumbled backwards but maintained the capability to use [REDACTED] weapon. Officer Altic and Arcata Police Officer Matthew O'Donovan closed to within a few feet of [REDACTED] before returning fire.

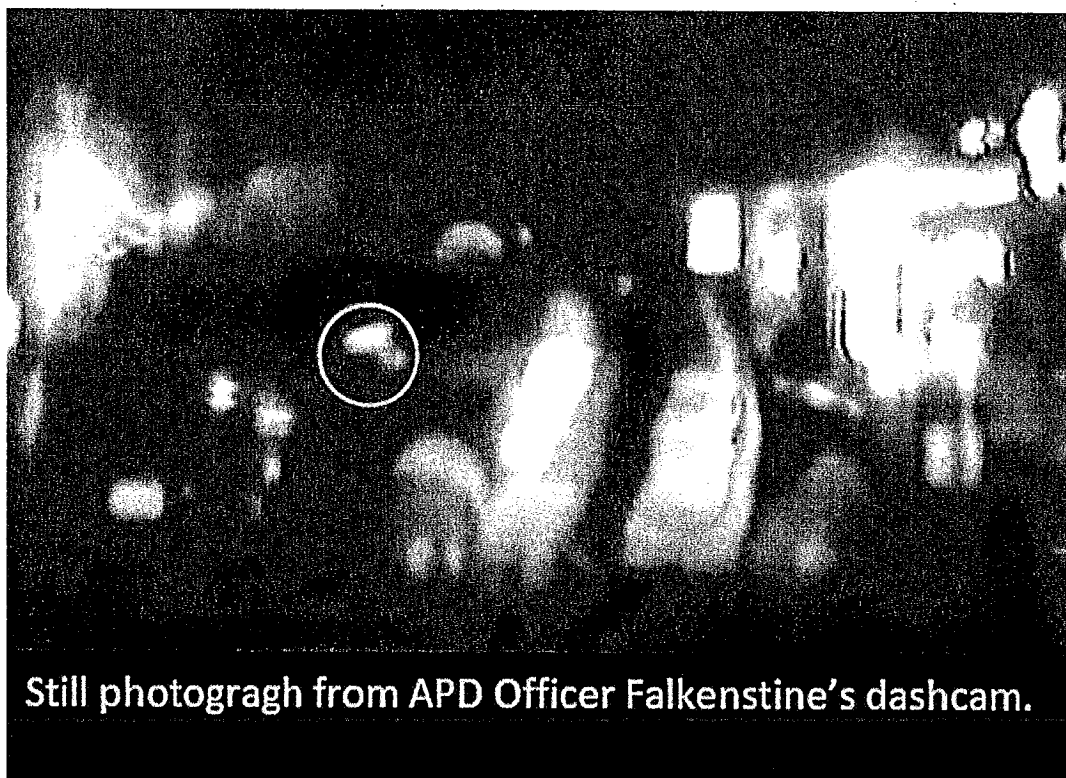
Eyewitness statements correspond with the video evidence that [REDACTED] fired first. Officer Altic later stated that he quickly advanced on [REDACTED] because he thought closing the distance between himself and [REDACTED] gun might allow him to take control of the assailant's weapon without firing his own.

Detectives interviewed [REDACTED] companions. Each confirmed the report of a preceding fight and claimed no knowledge of [REDACTED] possession of a gun until [REDACTED] brandished it just before the shooting started. Additional investigation revealed that [REDACTED] had been sentenced to probation in November, 2016 for felony evasion and the handgun [REDACTED] used in the incident had been stolen.

All the evidence collected by a forensic scientist and evidence technicians corresponded with video evidence and eyewitness statements. An autopsy conducted by Dr. Mark Super confirmed that [REDACTED] died of multiple gunshot wounds. Toxicological analysis revealed [REDACTED] had a blood alcohol level of 0.12 and cocaine metabolite in [REDACTED] system.

District Attorney (DA) Maggie Fleming has concluded the shooting was legally justified. The applicable legal standard focuses on whether the officers reasonably believed that they were in imminent danger of being killed or suffering great bodily injury. In summarizing the case, the DA stated: "Officer Altic received a bullet wound before he and Officer O'Donovan fired their weapons, removing any doubt about the justification for the actions of the two officers. I'm sure the community shares my great appreciation for the exceptional efforts of officers Altic and O'Donovan to protect the public." [REDACTED] family has been informed of the DA's conclusion.

In keeping with the Humboldt County policy on release of video evidence in officer-involved shootings developed by DA Fleming in collaboration with the Sheriff's Department along with cities and their law-enforcement agencies, the dashcam video from Officer Falkenstine's vehicle is being made available to the public.

1 NARRATIVE:

2 On 9/9/2017 at about 0141 hours, Humboldt State University Police and Arcata Police were  
3 involved in a shooting near the Arcata Plaza. The shooting resulted in one deceased [REDACTED]  
4 identified as [REDACTED], and a wounded HSU PD Officer, identified as Louis Altic.

5  
6 At approximately 0300 hours, I was notified as part of the Humboldt County Critical Response  
7 Team Investigations team to respond to assist in the investigation. Upon my arrival at APD, I was  
8 briefed as to the known details of the incident to that point. HCSO Detective Sgt. Dianna Freese  
9 and I were tasked with conducting interviews of subjects who were with [REDACTED] at the time of the  
10 incident. The two subjects we were tasked with interviewing had been identified as [REDACTED]  
11 and [REDACTED]. Two other subjects, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were friends of  
12 [REDACTED] and witnessed the incident. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were interviewed by EPD Detective Bise  
13 and HCDA Investigator Morris. All four subjects were in separate rooms at APD waiting to be  
14 interviewed.

16 [REDACTED]  
17 We first spoke with [REDACTED] in an interview room at APD. I located [REDACTED] laying on a bed in an  
18 unlocked holding cell. [REDACTED] was wearing an Arcata Police Department Jacket which had been  
19 loaned to him by officers. I informed [REDACTED] that he was a witness and asked him if he would speak  
20 with me about what happened. [REDACTED] agreed and was cooperative. I escorted [REDACTED] to an  
21 interview room to continue speaking with him. The interview was recorded and a copy of the  
22 recording was later booked in as evidence. The following is a summary of what [REDACTED] told me.

24 [REDACTED] stated he was from [REDACTED] and had been in [REDACTED] off and on over the past two or

34 not know their names. [redacted], [redacted], and [redacted] met up with the "[redacted]" at a  
35 house in [redacted], belonging to a subject known only as "[redacted]". They smoked  
36 marijuana at "[redacted]" house before leaving for the party in McKinleyville. [redacted] said they smoked  
37 "OG" marijuana.

38  
39 They drove in two separate cars to McKinleyville with [redacted], [redacted], and [redacted] in [redacted]  
40 truck and the "[redacted]" in a second red sedan. They stopped off in Arcata at the Plaza  
41 Liquors, 786 9th St. in Arcata, and purchased some Pabst Blue Ribbon Beer then continued to the  
42 party. When they got to the party in McKinleyville they drank shots of Hennessy (A brand of cognac  
43 alcoholic beverage) and drank the beer. [redacted] consumed about 4 shots of Hennessy but did not  
44 see how much [redacted] drank. They remained at the party until HCSO deputies arrived and shut the  
45 party down.

46  
47 [redacted] described the seating order in [redacted] truck after the party was as follows. [redacted]  
48 was in the driver's seat, [redacted] was in the front passenger's seat, [redacted] was seated directly  
49 behind [redacted] and the two "[redacted]" were in the middle back and driver's side rear.

51 After the party, they decided to go to the bars on the Arcata Plaza along with a few female subjects  
52 they met at the party. [redacted], [redacted], [redacted] and two of the "[redacted]" rode in  
53 [redacted] truck, two other "[redacted]" rode in a [redacted] sedan (possibly a [redacted]), while  
54 the females rode in a third vehicle. [redacted] lost sight of the females and their vehicle while enroute  
55 and did not see them again. [redacted] believed the [redacted] sedan with two of the "[redacted]"  
56 made it to the plaza but he wasn't sure where they went.

58 [redacted] did not know what time it was when they left the party because he was "faded". I asked  
59 [redacted] what "faded" meant and he replied that he was drunk.

61 Upon their arrival at the plaza, [redacted] parked the truck near the front of the Alibi, 744 9th St. in  
62 Arcata. At first, [redacted] said the police pulled up behind them almost immediately after they parked.  
63 Later, [redacted] explained that they had walked around the plaza and visited a couple bars prior to  
64 police contacting them. [redacted] said there was an altercation with "some bitches", or female  
65 acquaintances. [redacted] said the female acquaintances saw him on the plaza and tried to fight with  
66 him. [redacted] said he did not fight back but merely dodged the blows from one of the females.  
67 [redacted] was aware of the cameras in the vicinity and did not want to get in trouble. [redacted] heard

71 As they were about to get in the truck they saw police arrive. [redacted] did not get into the truck yet

74 set police officer called him over to talk to him. He was speaking with the officer when he saw

75 [redacted] exit the truck with a gun in [redacted] hand and wave it at the police officers. [redacted] described how  
76 [redacted] was holding the gun buy extending [redacted] right arm out and waving it side to side. [redacted]  
77 described the gun as a black and silver handgun. [redacted] said he couldn't believe what he was  
78 seeing and did not want to watch what happened next so he closed his eyes and began walking  
79 away as he heard gunshots. [redacted] said he did not know what officers were saying to [redacted] but

100 I then located [redacted] sleeping in an office and woke him. I asked him if he was able to  
101 speak with me and he agreed. I walked him back to the interview room where Sgt. Freese and I

105 [redacted] told me [redacted] was the brother of [redacted] girlfriend but had only met him once

116 When they got to the plaza they walked around for a bit until [REDACTED] saw a fight break out.  
117 [REDACTED] say [REDACTED] was involved and tried to break up the fight. As he tried to break it up he saw  
118 [REDACTED] had a "grayish and blackish" gun and was waving it around in the fight. [REDACTED] then  
119 turned away, grabbed [REDACTED], and walked away. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] decided they wanted to go

5 On 9/9/17 I was assigned to the Eureka Police Department's Criminal Investigations Section as a

77 ██████ thought one of the police officers had attempted to grab ██████ and ██████ had pulled away  
78 from the officer causing ██████ to fall to the ground.

80 ██████ noticed ██████ was holding a handgun in ██████ right hand as ██████ was falling backwards.  
81 ██████ described the handgun as, "the upper (frame) was silver" and it was a "45". I asked ██████

9 **SUMMARY:**

10 On 9-9-2017, at about 0126 hours, Arcata PD and Humboldt State University PD  
11 officers responded to the Arcata Plaza for a reported disturbance. Their investigation led  
12 to the inquiry of occupants of a pickup truck, one who was alleged to have brandished a  
13 firearm.

14  
15 During this investigation, [REDACTED] brandished a firearm at Officer Altic. As Officer  
16 Altic attempted to arrest [REDACTED], [REDACTED] shot and hit Officer Altic. HSU Officer Altic and  
17 APD Officer O'Donovan returned fire and killed [REDACTED] Arcata PD and HSU PD  
18 initiated a CIRT callout.

19  
20 **NARRATIVE:**

21 **Notification;**

22 On 9-9-17, at about 0344 hours, I was contacted at home by Captain O'Neill. Captain  
23 O'Neill advised that Arcata PD had an officer involved shooting and the Critical  
24 Incident Response Team had been initiated. I was to respond to Arcata PD for a CIRT  
25 briefing.

26  
27 The CIRT briefing was led by APD Sgt. Det. Dokweiler. His co-lead was District  
28 Attorney Investigator Gary Cooper. I was teamed with HSU Property/Evidence  
29 Technician, Zan Mendonca. We were tasked with:

- 30 > Documenting and collecting evidence from Officer Matthew O'Donovan.
- 31 > Collecting appropriate evidence belonging to [REDACTED] at the hospital as well  
32 as documenting the condition of [REDACTED] and witnessing the sealing of [REDACTED] body  
33 bag for the chain of evidence.
- 34 > Collecting clothing and gear belonging to Officer Louis Altic and determining  
35 from Officer Altic how his firearm and magazines were loaded.

36  
37 At the time of the evidence collection, my knowledge of the incident was slim.  
38 Essentially, I knew that the [REDACTED] was deceased and at the hospital awaiting the

39 coroner's office. I knew that Officer O'Donovan had fired his gun at [redacted] and the  
40 action was close range, possibly he was engaged physically. I believed that Officer Altic  
41 had been in a close quarter physical altercation with the suspect, was shot through the  
42 upper leg and also shot at the suspect. I did not know how many times each officer shot  
43 their firearms nor how many shots [redacted] fired. The decision on what and how to collect  
44 evidence was based on this information.

45

46 *Officer Matthew O'Donovan;*

47 On 9-9-2017 at about 0525 hours we began processing Officer O'Donovan in a private  
48 room in the Arcata Police Department. I examined Officer O'Donovan and saw he was  
49 wearing a black Arcata PD uniform clearly marked as Law Enforcement with patches on  
50 the upper sleeve, a badge displayed over his left breast pocket and a name tag over his  
51 right breast pocket. His duty belt contained a firearm on his right hip, a two way radio,  
52 keys holder, two extra magazines, two handcuffs in one holder, pepper spray and an  
53 electronic door opener for his K9 vehicle.

54

55 Officer O'Donovan said he loaded his firearm with 16 rounds and his two extra  
56 magazines with 15 rounds. I counted the bullets from the firearm and found there were  
57 11 Speer .40 caliber bullets in his firearm. If Officer O'Donovan was correct in how he  
58 loaded his firearm it meant that he shot his gun five times. I counted the bullets in his  
59 spare magazines and he had 15 Speer .40 caliber bullets in each magazine.

60

61 Zan Mendoca photographed Officer O'Donovan's hands, forearms and clothing. We  
62 had Officer O'Donovan strip off his shirt and photographed his upper body. The  
63 probative purpose these photographs were to document any injuries Officer O'Donovan  
64 might have or the lack of injuries. I saw no injuries that I could confirm were caused in  
65 the last several hours.


66

67 I inspected Officer O'Donovan's clothes and equipment for any shell casings that may  
68 have become lodged or hidden upon his person and found none. I collected his outer  
69 uniform clothing because they may contain trace evidence that linked Officer  
70 O'Donovan to [redacted] or the environment present at the incident scene. I collected  
71 anything that could have been used as a weapon to include personal knives, pepper  
72 spray, electronic stun guns and flashlights. I also collected his digital audio recorder in  
73 case it recorded any part of the incident.



87 We inspected the notebook found in his breast pocket and noted it contained normal  
88 notes that might be taken by a patrol officer in the field. We inspected the Kevlar vest  
89 and found no damage to the vest. We inspected his duty belt for blood, damage or even  
90 scuff marks and found none.

92 The following is a list of evidence collected from Officer O'Donovan and the probative  
93 purpose for its collection.

- 94       ➤ Evidence item 16 is O'Donovan's OC spray canister. This item was collected


131 We terminated the process with Officer O'Donovan at about 0631 hours.

133 *Mad River Hospital Emergency Room 1;*

134 We arrived at the Mad River Hospital E.R. at about 0658 hours. [REDACTED] was  
135 deceased in room 1. Maintaining chain of custody of [REDACTED] was HCSO Det. Jennifer  
136 Turner and APD Officer Josh Phinney. Laying on the floor of the room was two socks, a  
137 pair of jeans, a wallet, a pair of shoes and a copper jacketed bullet. The bullet was  
138 covered by a protective plastic pill bottle. Zan Mendoca photographed the items as I  
139 examined them and collected them. I changed sterile gloves for this process so as not to  
140 contaminate [REDACTED] clothing with O'Donovan's DNA. The following is a summary of  
141 the items collected and its description and probative value:

- 142      ➤ Evidence item 31 is [REDACTED] blue jeans. The jeans had been cut up the left pant
- 143      leg assumedly by medical personnel to facilitate the removal of the pants. There
- 144      was a web belt in the pants. There was blood on both the belt and the pants but
- 145      not a lot of blood. There did not appear to be any bullet holes in the jeans
- 146      although there was an elongated hole at the left hip just below the belt. If a bullet
- 147      caused the hole it would have been tumbling and tore through sideways. There
- 148      was no blood stains or bits of flesh anywhere around this tear in the clothing. It
- 149      is not conclusive the hole is a bullet hole.
- 150      ➤ Evidence item 32 is one gray sock. I examined the sock for bullet holes, tears or
- 151      blood and saw none.
- 152      ➤ Evidence item 33 is one gray sock. I examined the sock for bullet holes, tears or
- 153      blood and saw none.


- 154 > Evidence item 34 and 35 were [REDACTED] shoes. The shoes were black Nike's. I
- 155 inspected the shoes and did not see any damage to the shoes nor visible blood.
- 156 > Evidence item 36 is [REDACTED] wallet. The wallet contained [REDACTED] ID card,

 172 Kevlar vest, two plastic bags containing police equipment and a paper bag with clothing.

 176 These items were later transported to Arcata PD headquarters, viewed and photographed  
 177 by myself and Zan Mendoca and booked. The following is a description of the items and  
 178 their probative value:

- 180 for forensic examination and comparison with evidence from the crime scene.



On 09/09/17 at about 0345 hours, I was notified by dispatch that an officer involved shooting had occurred on the Arcata Plaza. Dispatch advised me the Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT) had been activated and requested I respond to Arcata Police Department (APD) as soon as possible.

At about 0430 hours, I arrived at APD and was escorted to a conference room. Several other members of the CIRT team were already present. APD Sergeant Todd Dokweiler began briefing members of the CIRT on the incident. I learned that officers were on the Arcata Plaza investigating a reported fight. While in the area, Humboldt State University Police Department (HSUPD) Officer Altic and APD Officer O'Donovan were involved in a shooting with a subject identified as [REDACTED]. During the incident, Officer Altic was shot in the leg and [REDACTED] had been shot and transported to the hospital where [REDACTED] was pronounced dead.

Sgt. Dokweiler requested I respond to Mad River Community Hospital (MRCH) where [REDACTED] body was located. At about 0515 hours, I arrived at MRCH. Also present at MRCH was APD Officers Marr and Phinney.

After arriving at the hospital, I met with [REDACTED] whom was the emergency room physician. I asked [REDACTED] if there was anything he could tell me in regards to [REDACTED] showing up to the hospital. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was essentially dead upon arrival as they could find no heartbeat. I asked [REDACTED] if any lifesaving efforts were performed at this time. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was given oxygen and compressions were performed for a short time, but [REDACTED] heartbeat was still flat lined. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was the physician that called the time of death for [REDACTED] which was called at 0207 hours.

Officer Phinney stood by at the hospital with me until Eureka Police Department (EPD) Detective Harpham and HSUPD Evidence Technician Mendonca arrived to collect evidence. Refer to Detective Harpham and/or E.T. Mendonca's reports for further information as to what evidence was collected. . At about 0730 hours, Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Deputy Coroner Enright arrived on scene and took possession of [REDACTED] body.

On 09/12/17, Sgt. Freese forwarded me an e-mail from Sgt. Dokweiler requesting assistance with interviewing a witness. I advised Sgt. Freese I would contact the witness, (W) [REDACTED], to obtain a statement.

At 1300 hours, I called [REDACTED] on the telephone number provided by Sgt. Dokweiler. I left a message requesting [REDACTED] contact me at the Sheriff's Office. At about 1530 hours, [REDACTED] returned my telephone call. The interview with [REDACTED] was digitally recorded, burned to an audio CD and later booked into evidence. The following is a summary of the interview with [REDACTED]. Refer to the audio CD for full and complete details:

I advised [REDACTED] that I heard [REDACTED] may have information in regards to the incident that we were currently investigating. [REDACTED] stated yes he did and added that he was really close to where the incident occurred. [REDACTED] stated that he was in front of Everett's when the incident occurred. [REDACTED] stated he wanted me to know that he had a limited perspective as to what happened and that he was completely unbiased, but as far as he was concerned, the officers did a great job of serving the community.

I asked [REDACTED] to tell me what happened. [REDACTED] stated he heard a lot of commotion, but by the time he focused his attention on where the commotion was coming from, the suspect was already falling onto the sidewalk. [REDACTED] stated he believed the suspect fell in front of Toby and Jack's bar. [REDACTED] stated at this time the police began to shoot. [REDACTED] stated that was about all he saw. [REDACTED] stated he was with a friend that had seen the whole incident. I asked [REDACTED] what his friend's name was. [REDACTED] stated it was [REDACTED]. After [REDACTED] stated the name, I recognized it as a witness that Investigator Peterson had been attempting to contact for a statement.

I asked [REDACTED] what he and [REDACTED] were doing in front of Everett's. [REDACTED] stated they were just hanging out trying to decide what they were going to do next. I asked [REDACTED] how long they had been out at the bars that night. [REDACTED] stated they had arrived at Sidelines Sports Bar around 11:30PM. I asked [REDACTED] what exactly he observed when he looked over after hearing the commotion. [REDACTED] stated he saw the suspect on the sidewalk "receiving rounds from the police." I asked [REDACTED] if he had heard shots being fired. [REDACTED] stated yes. I asked [REDACTED] how many shots he heard being fired. [REDACTED] stated he recalled telling a friend he believed about nine shots had been fired. I asked [REDACTED] if he could see who was firing the shots. [REDACTED] stated he observed several officers with their guns out, but he could not say for sure who was actually firing the shots. I asked [REDACTED] if he recalled how many officers he observed firing their weapons. [REDACTED] stated he was not certain, but he was comfortable saying it was between two and five officers.

I asked [REDACTED] if he heard the officers saying anything. [REDACTED] stated no, but added that he later thought it was weird that he could not remember the officers announcing themselves. I asked [REDACTED] what he saw after he heard the shots being fired. [REDACTED] stated he observed officers run up to the suspect. [REDACTED] stated the officers were either placing the suspect in handcuffs or performing CPR. [REDACTED] stated it also could have been both. I asked [REDACTED] if he heard the suspect make any statements. [REDACTED] stated no, because when he saw [REDACTED] at that point, he appeared to be lifeless. I asked [REDACTED] how many people he believed were in the area during the incident. [REDACTED] stated he would estimate there were about 100 people.

The interview with [REDACTED] ended a short time later.

REPORT: On 09/09/17 at about 0126 hours, I was on uniformed patrol in a marked patrol car, when I received information of a large fight in front of Everett's Club on the Arcata Plaza. I responded to the Arcata Plaza to assist the Arcata Police Department. When I arrived at about 0128 hours, the fight was already broken up and the involved parties had separated. I exited my patrol car and met with HSU Officer Altic, his ride-along, and Arcata Police Officer O'Donovan.

We were standing on the north side of 9th Street in the 700 Block watching the crowd as they exited the bars. A [redacted] subject, who Officer Altic identified, was pointing out a subject who had been involved in the fight prior to our arrival. The subject who he pointed out to me was a [redacted] [redacted] adult, who was later identified as [redacted]. [redacted] was wearing baggy blue jeans with a bleached strip that ran the length of the rear of the pants from ankle across the seat of the pant and down to the other ankle. I watched [redacted] stagger and stumble as [redacted] walked in front of the bars. I continued to watch [redacted] and saw [redacted] was associated with a [redacted] truck parked to the east of the Everett's Club (784 9th Street) front door. I noticed several other males entering and exiting the same gray truck.

As I watched the front of the bars APD Officer O'Donovan requested DMV information for the [redacted] truck. Shortly after he received return information for the truck it was decided we contact the occupants of the truck. [redacted] was seated on the passenger side of the truck. I do not know if [redacted] was seated in the front passenger seat or the right rear passenger seat. I saw two more males seated in the rear passenger seat, one in the middle and one in the left rear passenger seat. The driver of the vehicle was at the back of the truck securing the rear camper window as we approached the vehicle.

APD Officer O'Donovan and I met with the driver at the driver's side of the vehicle as Officer Altic stayed to the rear of the truck. As APD Officer O'Donovan spoke with the driver the left rear passenger door opened and the passenger attempted to get out of the truck. I advised him to stay where he was seated. At some point I noticed the right front passenger had exited the truck as well as the right rear passenger.

My attention was then drawn to Officer Altic when I heard him yell at someone between the [redacted] truck and the next vehicle parked about two parking spots to the east and in front of Toby and Jack's Tavern (764 9th Street). I saw Officer Altic run towards the front of Toby and Jack's Tavern. I then ran to the front of the [redacted] truck and as I rounded the front of the truck I saw [redacted] getting up from a sort of kneeling position. I saw [redacted] raise a firearm towards Officer Altic as I drew my firearm from its holster.

As I brought my firearm up to sight I saw the first muzzle flash from the firearm [redacted] had pointed at Officer Altic and then a second muzzle flash as Officer Altic continued to advance while returning fire at [redacted] APD Officer O'Donovan who was to the right of me also advanced while firing at [redacted]. Due to the positioning of Officer Altic and APD Officer O'Donovan, and hearing several shots from each of them, I did not fire any rounds at [redacted].

During my career, I have investigated thousands of felony crimes, have been assigned to an investigative capacity for the last year and a half, and have broad experience in nearly all forms of law enforcement.

On 09-09-2017 Arcata Police Officers O'Donovan and Sgt Altizer assisted by Officers Altic and O'Conner from HSU Police Department responded to the 700 block of 9<sup>th</sup> Street in Arcata for a report of a fight. When Officers arrived on scene they talked with a witness who told them a person inside a pickup truck had gotten out of the truck and brandished a pistol and was now back inside the truck. The witness pointed out the truck to the Officers. The truck was a [REDACTED] pickup license [REDACTED].

As Officers were contacting the occupants of the truck and talking with them, a [REDACTED] subject later identified as [REDACTED] exited the right rear door of the truck and started firing a handgun at the Officers. The Officers returned fire striking [REDACTED] [REDACTED] ultimately succumbed to his wounds.

The handgun [REDACTED] used was recovered at the scene. The truck he had been sitting in was seized at the scene as evidence. The truck was towed to Buddy's Tow in Arcata and was being held as evidence pending a search warrant which I obtained on 09-12-2017 by me.

On 09-13-2017 Detective Dokweiler and I served search warrant number 1700447 on the truck. While searching the truck, I found a cell phone on the front seat of the truck. It was photographed and seized as evidence. Located in the front passenger door pocket of the truck was a Samsung tablet. It was also photographed and seized as evidence. Neither Detective Dokweiler or I have any prior knowledge of who these devices belong to.

During this investigation, a witness was interviewed. He told investigators he had been with [REDACTED] a good portion of the evening. I also know from training and experience that persons involved in criminal activity often retain evidence of their crimes on their phones, including images and videos, and that the phone and tablet in this case may in fact contain such files.

Further, I know from training and experience that persons involved in criminal activity often communicate with others about their activities. These communications can take place over cellular telephones or tablets using WI-FI which can be evidence by stored text messages, call logs, contact lists or e-mails.

With regard to the cellular telephones and electronic tablets, I know from training and experience that a forensic examination of them could provide information vital to this investigation, including but not limited to; call records, text messages, digital images, internet correspondence.

The cellular phone and Samsung tablet collected from the truck will be forwarded and processed by Humboldt County District Attorney Investigator Martin Perrone. The information and data collected will be stored and retained indefinitely, therefore, no time period limitations under Penal Code section 1546.1(d)(1) are appropriate.

Based on the above listed information your affiant believes that a search of the listed electronic devices will provide evidence of felony violations of the California Penal Code. He requests a search warrant be issued for the property listed in this affidavit at the locations described above.
